AN ACT amending the Howard County Code to allow an additional revision during 2009 <u>THROUGH JUNE 30, 2010</u> of the phasing schedule for a residential development, under certain conditions; to allow unphased projects to become phased projects in 2009 <u>THROUGH JUNE 30, 2010</u>; and providing that this Act shall be null and void after a certain date; and generally relating to phased residential developments.

WHEREAS, as of January 2009, in the United States and globally we have been in an economic
 recession in which unemployment rates have been at near record highs and consumer confidence
 has been at near record lows; and

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5 WHEREAS, the business community has been struggling in the market place to provide quality
6 products at a cost that both encourages consumer confidence and satisfies outstanding financial
7 obligations; and

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9 WHEREAS, in Howard County landowners also have experienced the pressures of the 10 economic downturn, resulting in a dramatic increase in the number of six-month extension 11 waiver requests to the County's Department of Planning and Zoning to assist in keeping 12 approved development plans viable and to prevent landowners from feeling forced to move 13 forward, potentially leading to financial instability and partially finished developments, creating 14 nuisances for county citizens.

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Section 1. Be it enacted by the County Council of Howard County, Maryland, that a new
Paragraph (2) "2009 Change to Phasing Schedule", of Subsection B "Phasing", of Section
16.1104 "Housing unit allocation process", of Subtitle 11 "Adequate Public Facilities", of Title
16 "Planning, Zoning and Subdivision and Land Development Regulations" of the Howard
County Code, is hereby added to read as follows:

1 2 (1) Changing phasing schedule: The schedule for completion of the phases of a phased project may be revised by the developer no more than once every 4 years 3 4 during the subdivision plan approval process. 5 (2) 2009 ADDITIONAL CHANGE TO PHASING SCHEDULE: IN ADDITION TO A CHANGE TO 6 7 THE PHASING SCHEDULE IN SUBSECTION (B)(1) ABOVE, THE SCHEDULE FOR 8 COMPLETION OF THE PHASES OF A PROJECT HAVING ALLOCATIONS MAY BE REVISED ONE TIME IN 2009 THROUGH JUNE 30, 2010 PROVIDED THAT THE AMENDED PHASE 9 10 OR PHASES ARE MOVED TO LATER YEARS IN THE SCHEDULE. IN ADDITION, A PLAN 11 THAT HAS ALLOCATIONS AND T HAT WAS NOT PREVIOUSLY PHASED MAY ALSO 12 REQUEST A PHASING SCHEDULE FROM THE DEPARTMENT OF PLANNING AND ZONING ONE TIME IN 2009 THROUGH JUNE 30, 2010. 13 14 [[(2)]](3) Comprehensive projects: Comprehensive residential projects may be phased at 15 16 the option of the developer, provided that housing unit allocations are available for the scheduled completion year of the initial phase of the project and for the 17 scheduled completion years of each additional phase of the project, except as 18 19 provided below. 20 If no allocations are available for the initial phase of a comprehensive project, or if too few allocations are available to make the initial phase viable, the developer 21 has the option to receive all tentative allocations in future years. However, in no 22 event shall the Department of Planning and Zoning grant more than 50% of the 23 24 total allocations available within any region for any future year for all projects 25 choosing this option. 26 [[(3)]](4) Conventional projects: Conventional residential projects may be phased if 27 there are sufficient housing unit allocations available for the scheduled 28 29 completion year of the initial phase of the project and for the scheduled completion years of each additional phase of the project. 30 31

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- 2 Section 2. And be it further enacted by the County Council of Howard County, Maryland, that
- 3 the provisions of this act shall become effective 61 days after enactment and shall remain
- 4 effective through December 31, 2009. On January 1, 2010 June 30, 2010. On July 1, 2010, this
- 5 Act shall be null and void without the necessity of further action of the County Council.
