Introduced by: The Chairperson at the request of the County Executive

AN ACT for the purpose of authorizing and empowering Howard County, Maryland to borrow money in the principal amount of up to \$46,629,000 on its full faith and credit, and issue and sell its bonds therefor, to be used to pay costs of certain County water and sewer capital projects which are specified and described in the County's 2010 Capital Budget (including, without limitation, borrowings for certain water and sewer capital projects previously authorized in calendar year 2005), and to pay costs of issuance of such bonds; authorizing the County to issue bond anticipation notes or to enter into installment purchase agreements for payment of portions of such costs; and to levy taxes upon the assessable property within the County sufficient, together with benefit assessments, ad valorem taxes levied upon the assessable property in the Metropolitan District and other available funds, to pay the debt service on such obligations; and providing for and determining various matters in connection therewith.

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As a part of the Capital Budget, it is necessary that Howard County, Maryland borrow a sum not exceeding \$46,629,000 to be used for (i) the financing and refinancing of certain water and sewer capital projects, specified and described in the Capital Budget (each a "Project", collectively, the "Projects"), and more particularly described in Appendix A attached hereto and incorporated herein, and (ii) payment of costs of issuance of any obligations issued to evidence such borrowing. Of such amount, \$3,529,000 appropriated for certain of such Projects was previously authorized to be borrowed by the County during calendar year 2005, as indicated in Appendix A in the column captioned "Amount to be Borrowed (Reauthorizations)", but such authorizations are expected to expire prior to the completion of such Projects or the sale of general obligation bonds to provide permanent financing therefor. Accordingly, it is necessary that such borrowing be reauthorized ("Reauthorizations").

**Section 1. Be it enacted by the County Council of Howard County, Maryland, That Howard County, Maryland (the "County"), is hereby authorized and empowered to borrow on its full faith and credit and issue and sell its bonds therefor, at one time or from time to time, an amount not exceeding \$10,000,000 the proceeds thereof to be used to finance and refinance the Projects more particularly identified and described in Appendix A attached hereto and in the Capital Budget; including for each Project, without limitation, the cost of planning, design, construction, reconstruction,, furnishing, construction, improvements, rehabilitation, remodeling, enlargements, engineering services, architects fees, surveys, landscaping, site development, evaluation studies, land acquisition and related items, interest on the bonds and incidental activities. The Projects and the amount to be borrowed for each (including,**

1 without limitation, any Reauthorizations), are more specifically identified and described in Appendix A  
2 attached hereto.

3 Proceeds of any bonds authorized by this Act may also be used to pay costs of issuance of such  
4 bonds.

5 **Section 2. And be it further enacted by the County Council of Howard County, Maryland,**  
6 That, pursuant to and in accordance with Article 31, Section 12 of the Annotated Code of Maryland, as  
7 amended, the County is also authorized to issue bond anticipation notes in anticipation of the issuance of  
8 the bonds authorized by this Act and described in Section 1 hereof, and all references to “bonds” or  
9 “obligations” in this Act shall include such bond anticipation notes, unless the context clearly requires a  
10 contrary meaning. It is intended that the aggregate principal amount of issued and outstanding bond  
11 anticipation notes when added to the aggregate principal amount of issued and outstanding bonds in  
12 anticipation of which such notes were issued, shall not exceed the aggregate principal amount set forth in  
13 Section 1 of this Act at any time. The County will agree in each ordinance described in Section 4 of this  
14 Act relating to any notes issued pursuant to this Act to pay such notes and the interest and premium, if  
15 any, thereon from the proceeds of the bonds in anticipation of the sale of which such notes are issued, and  
16 the County will agree to issue such bonds when, and as soon as, the reason for deferring their issuance no  
17 longer exists.

18 **Section 3. And be it further enacted by the County Council of Howard County, Maryland,**  
19 That, in connection with the acquisition of real property as part of a Project, the County may incur all or  
20 any portion of the indebtedness authorized by this Act for such acquisition by entering into an installment  
21 purchase agreement pursuant to and in accordance with Section 4.201A of the Howard County Code  
22 (“Section 4.201A”) or any successor provisions of law in lieu of issuing bonds for such acquisition. The  
23 principal amount of any such installment purchase agreement shall not exceed the lesser of (a) the  
24 maximum principal amount permitted by Section 4.201A or (b) the portion of the amount to be borrowed  
25 for such Project (as set forth in Section 1 hereof) which relates to such acquisition. All references to

1 “bonds” or “obligations” in this Act shall include such installment purchase agreements, unless the  
2 context clearly requires a contrary meaning.

3 **Section 4. And be it further enacted by the County Council of Howard County, Maryland,**  
4 That the County Council of Howard County, by an ordinance or ordinances adopted from time to time in  
5 accordance with Article VI of the Charter and other applicable provisions of law, shall provide for (a) the  
6 issuance and sale of, (b) the maximum principal amount, designation, form, tenor and denomination or  
7 denominations of, (c) the dates of the first maturity (not more than two years after the date of issue) and  
8 the last maturity (not more than 30 years after the date of issue) of, and (d) the interest rate or rates per  
9 annum (or the method of determining such rate or rates) payable on, any bonds or other obligations issued  
10 from time to time under this Act; and may by any such ordinance, or by separate resolution, provide that  
11 the issue of bonds or other obligations hereby authorized be consolidated with one or more other issues.

12 **Section 5. And be it further enacted by the County Council of Howard County, Maryland,**  
13 That for the purpose of paying the principal of and interest on such bonds or other obligations as the same  
14 shall become payable, the County Council of Howard County shall levy annually ad valorem taxes upon  
15 the assessable property in the County sufficient, together with benefit assessments, ad valorem taxes  
16 levied upon assessable property in the Metropolitan District and other available funds, to pay the principal  
17 of and interest on such bonds or other obligations until all of such bonds or other obligations shall mature  
18 and be redeemed.

19 **Section 6. And be it further enacted by the County Council of Howard County, Maryland,**  
20 That any bonds or other obligations issued from time to time under this Act are specifically exempt from  
21 the provisions of Article 31, Sections 9, 10 and 11 of the Annotated Code of Maryland, as amended, and  
22 any successor provision of law.

23 **Section 7. And be it further enacted by the County Council of Howard County, Maryland,**  
24 That all bonds or other obligations authorized hereby shall be issued within four years from the date this  
25 Act becomes effective. Notwithstanding the foregoing, if bond anticipation notes are issued within such

1 period in accordance with Section 2 hereof, the bonds authorized hereby may be issued until the final  
2 maturity date of such notes.

3 **Section 8. And be it further enacted by the County Council of Howard County, Maryland,**  
4 That the County anticipates that a portion of the costs of some or all of the Projects may be paid prior to  
5 the issuance of the bonds or other obligations authorized hereby. The amount of such costs so paid will  
6 depend on various factors, including, without limitation, the timing and speed of progress on the Projects,  
7 the availability of other funds to pay such costs on an interim basis, bond and money market conditions  
8 and compliance with federal and State laws and regulations.

9 Accordingly, the County reasonably expects to reimburse costs of the Projects (as described  
10 herein) with proceeds of the bonds or other obligations authorized hereby, such bonds or other obligations  
11 to be issued by the County in the maximum principal amount of \$46,629,000.

12 **Section 9. And be it further enacted by the County Council of Howard County, Maryland,**  
13 That this Act shall take effect sixty-one (61) days after its enactment.
