2	"Preservation Parcel, Neighborhood", of Section 103 "Definitions" of the Howard County
3	Zoning Regulations is hereby amended to read as follows:

8	SECTION 103: Definitions
9	
10	A. Except as provided for in Section 101 herein, terms used in these regulations shall have the
11	definition provided in any standard dictionary, unless specifically defined below or in any other
12	provision of these regulations:

14	122. Preservation Parcel, Neighborhood: A residential infill parcel in the R-20, R-12, or R-ED
15	zoning districts that existed on September 9, 2008 and is designated as a sending parcel
16	on a revision plat or a final plat or easement. A Neighborhood Preservation Parcel shall
17	be encumbered by a Neighborhood Preservation Parcel Easement, AND IS EITHER
18	improved with an existing dwelling unit, OR IF UNIMPROVED, MUST BE OWNED AND
19	MAINTAINED BY A HOMEOWNERS ASSOCIATION OR DEDICATED TO THE HOWARD
20	COUNTY DEPARTMENT OF RECREATION AND PARKS. [[and any]] ANY new structures
21	placed on the site shall not be larger than 50 percent of the building footprint of the
22	dwelling unit existing at the time the Neighborhood Preservation Easement is recorded,
23	except as provided in Section 128.L.2.b.
