AN ACT amending *PlanHoward 2030*, the general plan for Howard County, to include Patapsco Heritage Area Management Plan and recognizing that the Plan is a way to further opportunities for recreation, environmental and historic conservation, and heritage tourism and to support economic development; and generally relating to planning, zoning and land use in Howard County.

1	WHEREAS, Howard County, in support of and in partnership with Patapsco Heritage
2	Greenway, Inc. that prepared a Patapsco Heritage Area Management Plan (the "Plan"), desires to
3	meet the conditions for approval in the Maryland Heritage Area Authority's resolution to
4	designate a portion of the Patapsco Valley area as a Certified Heritage Area as part of the
5	Maryland System of Heritage Areas; and

7	WHEREAS, the Patapsco Heritage Area has important environmental, recreation, and
8	cultural resources, as well as significant historical sites and districts on the National Register of
9	Historic Places; and
10	
11	WHEREAS, the Patapsco Heritage Area presents opportunities for recreation,
12	environmental and historic conservation, and heritage tourism and to support economic
13	development; and
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15	WHEREAS, the Plan will complement other state and county initiatives in the Certified
16	Heritage Area; and
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18	WHEREAS, by approval of Council Resolution No. 96-2014, the County Council
19	approved and authorized the submittal of the Plan to the State of Maryland for its approval; and
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21	WHEREAS, in July of 2012, by passage of Council Bill No. 26-2012, the Howard
22	County Council adopted PlanHoward2030, a new general plan for Howard County; and

24	WHEREAS, the County Council now wishes to amend <i>PlanHoward2030</i> in order to
25	include the Plan.

27	NOW, THEREFORE,
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29	Section 1. Be It Enacted by the County Council of Howard County, Maryland, that

PlanHoward2030 is hereby amended to include the Patapsco Heritage Area Management Plan
 as follows and as more specifically shown in the attached pages:

- 3 1. A new item "c" is added to Policy 3.4 on page 20; and
- 4 2. New page 20.1 is added.

6 Section 2. And Be It Further Enacted by the County Council of Howard County, Maryland that the
7 Director of the Department of Planning and Zoning may correct obvious errors, capitalization,
8 spelling, grammar, headings and similar matters and may publish this amendment to
9 PlanHoward2030 by adding or amending covers, title pages, a table of contents, and graphics to
10 improve readability.

12 Section 3. And Be It Further Enacted by the County Council of Howard County, Maryland,

13 that this amendment be attached to and made part of PlanHoward2030.

15 Section 4. And Be It Further Enacted by the County Council of Howard County, Maryland, that

16 this Act shall become effective 61 days after its enactment.

POLICY 3.3 – Use watershed management plans to guide the protection and restoration of water resources.

Implementing Actions

- a. Watershed Management Plans. Prepare comprehensive watershed management plans for all watersheds, to set priorities and guide efforts to protect, restore, and improve the County's water resources. Complete and update all watershed management plans on a regular cycle.
- Forest Cover and Riparian Forest Buffers. Establish and achieve measurable goals for forest cover and riparian forest buffers in all County watersheds.
- Resident Participation. Encourage active participation of individuals, businesses, and local community and environmental organizations in restoration activities.
- Wetlands. Develop a wetlands program to inventory, map, protect, and enhance wetland resources.
- Dedicated Funding. Institute a dedicated fund (often referred to as a stormwater utility) to ensure increased and sustained funding for the watershed management program.

f. Grant and Cost-Share Opportunities. Pursue Federal and State grant and cost-share opportunities to secure additional resources for restoration efforts. Apply jointly with community and environmental organizations and with neighboring jurisdictions as appropriate.

POLICY 3.4 – Coordinate regional protection of water resources.


Implementing Actions

Patuxent and Patapsco Rivers.
 Coordinate and cooperate with other

local, regional, and State agencies and organizations on joint watershed planning and management for the Patuxent and the Patapsco Rivers.

- Patapsco Heritage Greenway. Coordinate with Baltimore County to accomplish certification of the Patapsco Heritage Greenway.
- c. Patapsco Heritage Area Management Plan. Work with the Patapsco Heritage Greenway, Inc. and Baltimore County to assist in implementing the management plan, certified by the Maryland Heritage Area Authority, for those portions that apply to Howard County.

Patapsco Heritage Area Amendment

The Maryland Heritage Areas Authority requires a county within a certified heritage area to include in the county's general plan those portions of the heritage area management plan applicable to the county. Meeting this requirement establishes the eligibility of qualified organizations and government entities, within the Howard County portion of the certified heritage area, for receipt of Maryland Heritage Areas Authority financial and other benefits including grants, loans, and tax credits.

Therefore, the version of the Patapsco Heritage Area Management Plan, as was approved by the Maryland Heritage Area Authority on January 15, 2015, insofar as it is consistent with the rest of PlanHoward 2030, is included within PlanHoward 2030 in order to further opportunities for recreation, environmental and historic conservation, and heritage tourism and to support economic development.

The map at left is illustrative and indicates the area of Howard County located within the certified heritage area as approved by the Maryland Heritage Areas Authority.

The Patapsco Heritage Area Management Plan defines its own purpose on page xi: "The heritage area's management plan provides the blueprint for coordinating ... many collaborative efforts. It is an advisory document demonstrating awareness of the heritage area's partners and stakeholders, their "buy-in", and general support for management concepts. ... Participation in plan implementation will be voluntary and will not be required as a result of potential actions identified in the approved management plan. ... Participation in the program does, however, gualify PHG [Patapsco Heritage Greenway, Inc.] and its partners and stakeholders such as Baltimore County, Howard County, and others – for potential state matching grants for actions identified in the plan or that otherwise support accomplishing the goals for the Patapsco Heritage Area."

Subject: Testimony for Council Bill _____-2015 General Plan Amendment (GPA) 2015-1 to PlanHoward 2030

On July 26, 2012, the Howard County Council adopted *PlanHoward 2030* as Howard County's new general plan. The fully searchable text of *PlanHoward 2030* is posted on the <u>DPZ portal page</u> and <u>Plan Howard site</u>.

Two years prior to adoption of *Plan Howard 2030*, on March 20, 2010, the County Council adopted CR9-2010 in support of efforts "to pursue Maryland State Heritage certification for the Patapsco Heritage Greenway."

On June 5, 2014, a draft Patapsco Heritage Area Management Plan and a proposed heritage area were presented to the Planning Board. The Planning Board heard public testimony and recommended for approval.

On July 25, 2014, Howard County Council adopted CR96-2014, "approving and authorizing submittal of a Management Plan for certification of the Patapsco Heritage Area as a Certified Maryland Heritage Area."

On January 15, 2015, Maryland Heritage Area Authority (MHAA) granted conditional approval for the Patapsco Heritage Area and the proposed Patapsco Heritage Area Management Plan with the following two conditions:

The adoption by each jurisdiction that will be within the Certified Heritage Area of an appropriate amendment of its local comprehensive/master plan to incorporate by reference, or by other means determined appropriate by the jurisdiction, all portions of the Patapsco Heritage Area Management Plan, except those portions solely relating to other jurisdictions within the Patapsco Heritage Area, as required under COMAR Title 14, Subtitle 29, Chapter 03, Section .05 (G); and, be it further resolved, that the local jurisdiction amendment shall be acceptable to the Authority.

On April 9, 2015, the Planning Board recommended for approval of GPA 2015-1 to include the Patapsco Heritage Area and the Patapsco Heritage Area Management Plan (PHAMP) in the adopted *PlanHoward 2030*.

Fiscal Impact

The PHAMP includes 52 actions for implementation by Howard County including specific departments and agencies; however, participation in the plan is voluntary and incurs no direct obligation, financial or otherwise. Howard County is free to participate in actions identified in the plan or to forego, depending on the availability of funding and budgetary constraints as determined annually through the operating and capital budget processes.
