In February 2014 Howard County became aware of the availability of grant funds through the Maryland Emergency Management Administration's Hazard Mitigation Grant Program. Howard County applied for grant funds to upgrade the County's flood warning system by adding additional gages and updating the flood warning computer hardware and software. In November 2014 Howard County was notified by MEMA that it had awarded \$33,600 in grant funds to Howard County.

Not knowing if and when MEMA would actually award such grants we did not budget for these funds in the current fiscal year. Expenditures for the operation and maintenance of our flood warning system is ongoing and therefor this SAO is necessary to transfer the funds as required in the grant.
