Section 1. Be it enacted by the County Council of Howard County, Maryland, that the Howard County Zoning Regulations are hereby amended to read as follows:

By adding:

“Schools, Commercial” to Section 118.0: “B-1 (Business: Local) District”

Subsection B. “Uses Permitted as a Matter of Right”

Number 47. “Schools, Commercial”

Howard County Zoning Regulations

SECTION 118.0: B-1 (BUSINESS: LOCAL) DISTRICT

A. Purpose

The B-1 District is established to provide areas of local business that can directly serve the general public with retail sales and services.

B. Uses Permitted as a Matter of Right


- 47. SCHOOLS, COMMERCIAL
- [[47]]48. Schools, private academic, including colleges and universities.
- [[48]]49. Service agencies.
- [[49]]50. Specialty stores.
- [[50]]51. Swimming pools, commercial or community.
- [[51]]52. Underground pipelines; electric transmission and distribution lines; telephone, telegraph and CATV lines; mobile transformer units; telephone equipment boxes; and other similar public utility uses not requiring a Conditional Use.
- [[52]]53. Volunteer fire departments.

Section 2. Be it further enacted by the County Council of Howard County, Maryland, that items 47 through 52 of the Section 118.0 B of the Zoning Regulations are hereby renumbered to be items 48 through 53, respectively.

Section 3. And Be it further enacted by the County Council of Howard County, Maryland, that this Act shall become effective 61 days after its enactment.
