1           **WHEREAS**, on April 14, 2015, the Governor, approved House Bill 145 which  
2 became Chapter 72, Acts of the General Assembly of 2015; and

4           **WHEREAS**, Chapter 72 provided that the compensation for the Howard  
5 County Alcoholic Beverage Hearing Board members shall be the amount set by the  
6 Howard County Council.

8           **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the County Council of Howard  
9 County, Maryland, this 5<sup>th</sup> day of October, 2015 that the compensation of the  
10 Alcoholic Beverage Hearing Board members for the performance of their duties shall be:

11           (1) for the chairperson, \$110 per meeting attended, not to exceed \$2,600 in a  
12 fiscal year regardless of the number of meetings attended; and

13           (2) for other Hearing Board members, \$100 per meeting attended, not to exceed  
14 \$2,400 in a fiscal year regardless of the number of meetings attended.

16           **AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the County Council of Howard  
17 County, Maryland, that the compensation set in this Resolution shall go into effect  
18 immediately and remain in effect until changed by the County Council.
