- 1 WHEREAS, Section 5-301 of the Education Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland 2 provides for a program under which the State shall pay, under certain circumstances, the costs of 3 approved public school construction and capital improvements; and
- 5 WHEREAS, under the program, the State Board of Public Works is authorized to adopt 6 rules, regulations, and procedures for the administration of the program; and

8 WHEREAS, the Board of Public Works requires each local Board of Education to 9 submit, annually, to the Interagency Committee on School Construction an updated and detailed 10 Capital Budget Request for the upcoming fiscal year and a 5-year Capital Improvement Program 11 Request, both of which must have been approved by the appropriate local governing body; and 12

WHEREAS, the County Council of Howard County has received and considered a report and recommendation from the Howard County Planning Board on the Board of Education's Capital Budget Request for Fiscal Year 2017 and the Capital Improvement Program Request for Fiscal Years 2018-2022.


#### Support for Use of Technology Funds in FY 2017 Capital Budget Request

Additional support for this funding includes:

- The timeline for replacement is estimated to be spring 2017 and coincides with the expiration of 4-year warranties purchased with the original equipment in 2012/2013.
- By the time technology is replaced the units will be 4-5 years old with expired repair warranties, operating systems that may not be upgradable, and hardware that may not run new versions of software to remain instructionally valid.
- Postponing the replacement of this technology will:
  - increase the frequency of repair which may reduce technology instruction time to students
  - increase the cost of repairs which will increase the use of operating budget funds
  - increase the amount of time school administrative employees may be without their technology due to repairs
  - increase the amount of time needed for on-line testing due to repairs
  - increase the occurrence of inadequate level of access to technology for students (student to computer ratio)
- This \$5 million capital budget request will only pay for the replacement of 4,666 computers, printers and MFDs. The other 11,107 computers deferred from FY15-17 which were slated for replacement are being postponed due to constrained funding.

Dear Ms. Sager:

As you are aware, the request for state funding of school construction projects must be approved annually by the County Council pursuant to Section 5-301 of the Education Article, Annotated Code of Maryland. This approval must take place by November 23, 2015.

To facilitate this approval we follow a process in which includes the public input and approval by the Board of Education. In order for the County Council to take action, the Planning Board must review the proposal to ensure General Plan conformance. Per your correspondence with Jennifer Bubenko of my staff we agree to the following schedule:

#### September 17

Board of Education approval of Superintendent's Capital Budget.

September 18

Provide you with spreadsheet pages for the Board's Capital Budget with copies to Lonnie R. Robbins, Chief Administrative Officer.

#### September 24

Bill will be pre-filed with the County Council.

#### October 5 (7:30 p.m.)

Legislation is introduced at the County Council session.

#### October 1 or 15 (TBD)

Planning Board holds public hearing on the legislation. (HCPSS representative must be present.)

#### October 19 (7:30 p.m.)

County Council holds public hearing on the legislation. (HCPSS representative must be present.)

#### October 26 (4:30 p.m.)

County Council holds public work session. (HCPSS representative must be present.)

#### November 2 (7:30 p.m.)

County Council votes on resolution.

We understand that County Council approval at this stage is only preliminary approval. The Council will act on the County Executive's Capital Budget request for the Board in May of 2016.
