



Good afternoon County Council Members,

I am writing to express my support for the proposed feasibility study in Council Bill 42-2015. I live in Oakland Mills and am employed as an urban designer/land planner. One reservation I have is the concept of the Oakland Mills Village Center (OMVC) as a regional recreation destination. In my opinion and professional experience the recreational components articulated by the Village Board in the VCCP are an inappropriate use and scale for a residential village center. These uses are associated with large footprint building envelops that are usually blank facades that do not contribute to the walkable streetscape environment one would envision at the heart of a residential community. They require large parking resources, much larger than what currently exists at the OMVC. Large parking lots are also not conducive to a walkable community center. When these lots become filled for events such as tournaments, parking then spills into the surrounding residential areas. The larger numbers of regional users of these facilities will arrive by Thunderhill Road and Steven Forest Road which are both lined with residential driveways. This is another reason why these types of facilities are generally located off of larger arterial streets to not draw traffic onto residential streets. Lastly, The Oakland Mills community is already, and will continue to, deal with a large regional recreation use in its back yard in Blandair Park. It does not seem equitable to locate another such use right in the community's center.

I have shared these concerns with Village Board members directly but found them to be unreceptive. I would encourage the County, should they move forward with the study, to consider a different approach to revitalization in Oakland Mills.

This memo addresses the questions that were posed at the recent legislative work session held on October 26, 2015. They included more detail on the timing of the study, study boundaries, project scope, and community engagement.

In terms of timing, DPZ would draft a request for proposal (RFP) within 3-4 weeks and then send it out to potential consultants by the end of November. Timing could be influenced by our internal procurement requirements. Barring any such delays, proposals would be due by early January with interviews scheduled for mid to late January. Allowing another two weeks or so for contract discussions the project should begin by mid-February 2016 and be completed within a 4-6 month period – early to mid-summer.

The study boundaries would consist of a planning area (the neighborhoods surrounding the Village of Oakland Mills) and a study area (a more targeted area consisting of the commercial area and the adjacent uses). The scope of the study would focus on the targeted study area. Community engagement would be broad-based, but targeted in a fair and open way to maximize stakeholder involvement. Again, the public's role would have to be clearly articulated – we do not see this as a visioning process but rather a more disciplined approach to identify and test options for land uses in Oakland Mills that are feasible from a market perspective. Consequently, much of the effort will be to keep the public informed about the process, market opportunities and constraints, and catalytic projects that would help reinvigorate the village center and broader community.

I hope this memo addresses your concerns. Please let me know if you need additional information.


Currently our Councilman, Dr. Calvin Ball, has pledged his vote for the bill. We need the votes of at least two other Council members. We would prefer all five.
