AN ACT requiring that bills for the Watershed Protection and Restoration Fee include a statement explaining why the fee continues to be imposed rather than why the fee used to be imposed; requiring that the statement identify the County Council members that voted against repealing the fee or whose votes or actions prevented the repeal of the fee, under certain circumstances; requiring that the statement name the County Executive instead if the Executive vetoed a bill to repeal the fee, under certain circumstances; and generally relating to billing for the Watershed Protection and Restoration Fee.

1	WHEREAS, in 2013 there was a requirement for a Watershed Protection and Restoration
2	Fee mandated by State Law, and
3	WHEREAS, based on that mandate, the County Council believed that Howard County real
4	property tax bill should specifically point out that imposition; and
5	WHEREAS, Council members Courtney Watson and Calvin Ball filed an amendment
6	(Amendment 3 to CB 38-2013) to that effect to place a statement to that effect on the property tax
7	bill as part of the passage of CB 38-2013 that established the Watershed Protection and Restoration
8	Fee; and
9	WHEREAS, the Council vote was four (4) in favor (Ball, Fox, Sigaty and Watson) and one
10	(1) opposed (Terrasa) to pass the amendment; and
11	WHEREAS, during the 2015 Maryland General Assembly the mandate for the Watershed
12	Protection and Restoration Fee was removed; and
13	WHEREAS, the decision to not repeal the Watershed Protection and Restoration Fee was a
14	result of the Howard County Council's actions related to CB 52-2015; and
15	WHEREAS, those proudly deciding to maintain the Howard County Watershed Protection
16	and Restoration Fee should have the honor of their names prominently listed as a footnote on the
17	Howard County real property tax bill as the ones causing that imposition.

12	(a) Billing Procedure. The Department of Finance may include the Watershed Protection and
13	Restoration Fee as a separate item on the real property tax bill for each property subject
14	to the fee.
15	(b) The real property tax bill shall, IF APPLICABLE, include a footnote on each bill that
16	indicates that the imposition of a stormwater remediation fee [[is mandated by state law]]
17	CONTINUES DUE TO THE FAILURE OF THE COUNTY COUNCIL TO PASS A BILL FOR SIGNATURE
18	by the County Executive for approval that would repeal the fee despite the
19	STATE MANDATE FOR THE FEE HAVING BEEN REMOVED, AND LISTING THE NAMES OF THE
20	COUNCIL MEMBERS THAT: 1) VOTED AGAINST REPEALING THE FEE, 2) VOTED FOR
21	AMENDMENTS THAT IN EFFECT RESULT IN THE FEE INCREASING IN ANY WAY OR
22	CONTINUING BEYOND JUNE 30, 2017; OR 3) WHOSE VOTES OR ACTIONS CAUSED A PROPOSED
23	REPEAL TO FAIL DUE TO A LACK OF TIMELY ACTION, WITHDRAWAL OF THE BILL, OR ANY
24	OTHER LEGISLATIVE PROCESS
25	(c) IF THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE VETOES A BILL PASSED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL THAT WOULD
26	REPEAL THE WATERSHED PROTECTION AND RESTORATION FEE PRIOR TO JULY 1, 2017, THE
27	REAL PROPERTY TAX BILL SHALL LIST THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE'S NAME AS BEING
28	RESPONSIBLE FOR THE CONTINUATION OF THE FEE, INSTEAD OF THE NAMES REQUIRED BY
29	SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION. Contact information for questions and appeals shall be
30	included with the bill's mailing.
