I've known Dale Martins for 25 years as her doctor, but I've also known her for much of that time as a successful small business owner. She has suffered greatly the past 2 years due to the complaint of a single person, who was mad at her for reasons not related to her business. As a result, she has had difficulty in continuing her successful pet grooming business that has in the past employed up to 3 others, and therefore provided significant tax payments to Howard County and the state of MD over the past 20-30 years. She has never had a complaint from a neighbor about her business, either in her current location since 2007, or in her previous location in Burtonsville for over a decade. She runs a clean, quiet business on nearly an acre, with much of her property being bordered along WSSC property near the reservoir. The other 2 sides are multiple acre lots. You would not even know there was a business there when you view her property from the street. Her neighbors are in favor of her keeping the business.

The county has admonished her for running her type of business on less than the 1 acre required. She in fact has 99.3% of an acre, being only 310 square feet short. Certainly 1 acre was perhaps a convenient number to pick when the law was legislated many years ago, but having 99.3% of an acre should meet the letter of the law in principal and certainly in a practical sense.

The situation has been hurting her health the past year or more as the saga has continued. Frankly it's been tearing her up due to the stress of not knowing whether she can continue a business she is so passionate about. Not only are local residents dependent on her for caring for their beloved pets, but she also is active in regional and national dog shows (like Westminster) in which her clients have won top prizes, in part due to her amazing talents. She is suffering the typical symptoms of prolonged stress including insomnia, GERD, anxiety, and depression. This is all a result of the stress of the past 2 years. Previously she had always been a very upbeat person with no health issues.

As a small businessman in Howard County myself, I implore you to provide Dale with the conditional use permit that will allow her to continue her small business. We can't afford to lose successful businesses like this – they provide needed services, they provide employment to others, and they pay taxes into our county and state coffers.

No other groomer would touch him without sedating and muzzling him. And then I found Dale. She very patiently worked with him for years and now, 8 years later, this dog is still with me and his nails can now be trimmed with no effort at all. There is no other groomer that was even willing to work with him without muzzling him, which would have put him under an extensive amount of stress, setting his rehab back weeks every time I needed his nails trimmed, but Dale took him on and has made all of the difference in the world to my dog.



I am writing in support of the home based grooming business for which the Martin are seeking approval at 10688 Harding Rd, Laurel, MD 20723.

I am a 30 year resident of Howard County and have been a real estate broker with Long and Foster for 33 years. I know the influence that local businesses have on our county, and I have no doubt that the business that the Martins plan to operate will only contribute to the community in a positive way!

I am aware that the Martins' property at 10688 Harding Rd. is registered in the tax records as .999 acre. As a real estate professional, I know if the property were surveyed again, it could possibly be 1 acre or slightly more. Surveying is not an exact science!!! If the Martins' property were in the tax record as an acre, this hearing would not be necessary! Personally, this drawn out process appears to be an unfair "witch hunt" initiated by a disgruntled neighbor.

I believe the county should approve the in-home grooming business of the Martins for the following reasons:

I am writing to encourage you to allow Dale Hutton Martins to continue her grooming business, and to grant her the conditional use permit that she seeks.

Dale and I are not related, nor do we have any other ties, with the exception that I have been taking my two dogs to her to be groomed for the last couple of years. I live in Prince George's County.

All of my dogs have been rescue dogs. When we first adopted in 2003 (a 10-year-old Lhasa Apso, who has since passed away), we were fortunate to find a groomer that we liked. Unfortunately that groomer moved out of the area, and is no longer available. We then had to look for another groomer, even going to big pet stores that had groomers. We were unable to find people who did quality work and were careful with the animals.

We now have two dogs, and until we found Dale, we were looking for someone who could groom them and do a quality job. We had a series of really bad experiences, including going to a well-known groomer who was so rough that we had to take one of our dogs to the vet afterwards.

Someone finally recommended Dale to us, and we have been thrilled with her work. She clearly loves dogs, and knows a lot about them. Her place is very clean, and she knows how to handle the dogs gently and professionally. There is ample secluded parking, well away from the road. She has taken steps to make sure the dogs cannot run away: the grooming is done indoors, of course, in a room at the back of her house, quite a distance from the road. The grooming space is enclosed, with a latched half-door. On the other side of the latched half-door, there is a small seating area, and a sturdy door leading outdoors that remains closed. The area beyond that door is fenced, and the gate in that fence is closed and has a sign on it telling people to keep it closed. Beyond this is the parking area, which is accessible through a large electric gate.

When I have taken my dogs to her, sometimes there are other dogs but she knows how to handle them and they are quiet, plus, they are indoors, so I cannot imagine that her grooming business or the dogs are a nuisance to anyone. In fact, just driving down the road, if you did not know her grooming salon was there, you would not guess that it was.

Dale does excellent work and is usually available on short notice, since her business is a small private one.

I am sure you can appreciate that finding a good groomer, like finding a good mechanic, is not an easy thing to do. And once you find someone who does quality work for a reasonable price, you don't want to lose them.

Small businesses should be encouraged. They bring people, and revenue, to the County. Dale Hutton Martins, and her small dog grooming business, are a credit to Howard County.

This breed is double-coated and requires hand stripping, rather than normal grooming, a technique which is not commonly done by commercial groomers. We travel over an hour from Centreville, VA every five weeks in order to have our two dogs stripped. Dale does a wonderful job providing this service. It is a tedious and physically demanding process, requiring anywhere from 45 minutes to 1 1/2 hours per dog to complete. If we couldn't come to her, it would be nearly impossible for us to find another groomer in the area who performs it.

It is our understanding that the main problem is the matter of her having her business on .999 of an acre, rather than a full acre, the county's legal requirement. Closing her business would be rather unfair in light of the fact that she is less than a percentage away from meeting this requirement. Please consider making an exception for her, as she provides a unique service for many owners and their pets. She is professional and a wonderful person, to boot. We would sorely miss our relationship with her and be sad to see her business closed.
