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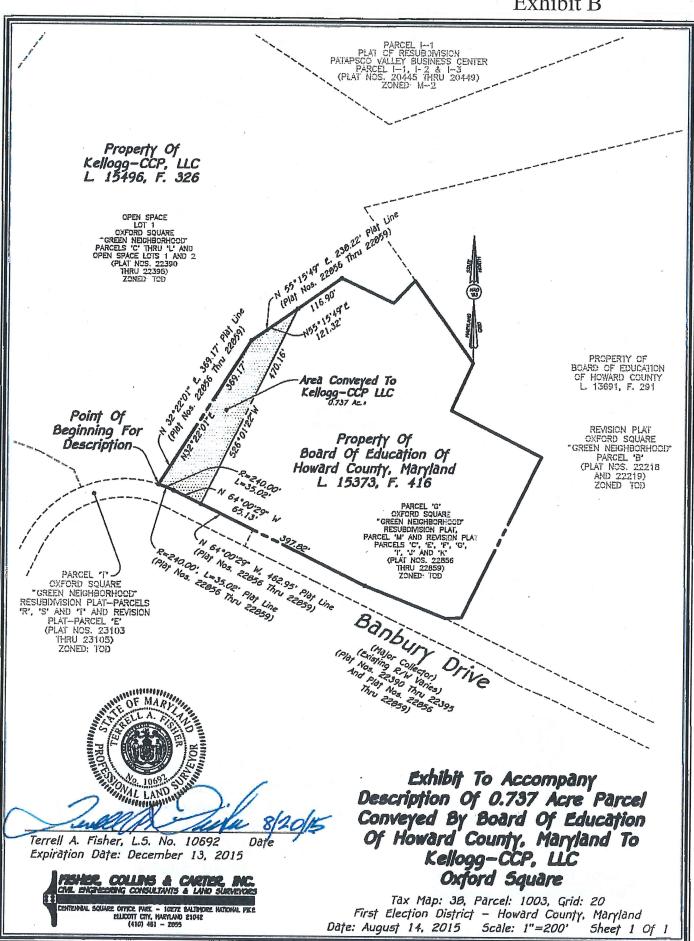

The Department of Public Works has been designated coordinator for preparation of testimony relative to the transfer of approximately 0.737 acres of land owned by the Board of Education and located along Banbury Drive to Kellogg-CCP, LLC in exchange for the acquisition of 0.737 acres of land owned by Kellogg-CCP, LLC.

The Board of Education of Howard County, Maryland (the "Board") is the fee simple owner of Parcel 'G' as shown on subdivision plats titled "Oxford Square 'Green Neighborhood' Resubdivision Plat – Parcels 'C' Thru 'L' And Open Space Lots 1 And 2 (A Resubdivision of Parcel 'A', as shown on plats entitled "Oxford Square, Parcels 'A' And 'B'" and recorded among the Land Records Of Howard County, Maryland as Plat Nos. 21757 thru 21761)" which plats are recorded among the Land Records of Howard County, Maryland (the "Land Records") as Plat Nos. 22390 thru 22395 (the "Plats") by virtue of a deed from Kellogg-CCP, LLC, dated October 30, 2013 and recorded among the aforesaid Land Records in Liber 15373, folio 416 (the "Board Property").

Kellogg-CCP, LLC ("Kellogg") is the fee simple owner of Open Space Lot 1, as shown on the Plats by virtue of a deed from Oxford Square Master Association, Inc. dated March 7, 2014 and recorded among the aforesaid Land Records in Liber 15496, folio 326 (the "Kellogg Property").

The Board and Kellogg have negotiated a land swap for the purpose of enhancing the value and use of their respective parcels. The acreage to be exchanged by parties is 0.737 acres as shown on Exhibit A and Exhibit B which are attached to the Resolution. The Board and Kellogg presented a Resubdivision Plat to the Department of Planning & Zoning titled "Resubdivision Plat Oxford Square 'Green Neighborhood' Parcels 'V' Thru 'Z', 'A-A' Thru 'C-C' And Open Space Lots 244 And 245 (Being A Resubdivision of Open Space Lot 1 As Shown on Plats Entitled "Oxford Square, 'Green Neighborhood', Parcels 'C' Thru 'L' And Open Space Lots 1 And 2" Recorded As Plat Nos. 22390 Thru 22395; A Resubdivision Of Parcel 'G', As Shown On Plats Entitled "Oxford Square, 'Green

Neighborhood' Resubdivision Plat – Parcel 'M' And Revision Plat – Parcels 'C', 'E', 'F', 'G', 'I', 'J', And 'K' Recorded as Plat Nos. 22856 Thru 22859; And A Resubdivision Of Parcels 'E', 'S', And 'T', As Shown On Plats Entitled "Oxford Square, 'Green Neighborhood', Parcels 'R', 'S', And 'T' And Revision Plat – Parcels 'E'" Recorded As Plat Nos. 23103 Thru 23105) And Revision Plat Oxford Square 'Green Neighborhood' Parcel 'B' (Being A Revision to Parcel 'B' As Shown On Plats Entitled "Revision Plat, Oxford Square, "Green Neighborhood", Parcel 'B'" Recorded As Plat Nos. 22218 And 22219)", (P&Z File No. F-15-008) and recorded among the aforesaid Land Records as Plat No. 23710 thru 23715 (the "Revision Plat") which has reconfigured the two parcels. Parcel G is now shown as Parcel BB containing 8.019 acres and Open Space Lot No. 1 is now shown as Parcel AA containing 3.536 acres as shown on Plat No. 23712 of the Revision Plat, a copy of which is attached to this testimony for reference.

Section 4.203 of the Howard County Code provides that when the Board of Education determines that real property of the Board is no longer needed for educational purposes, but that other property is available which is needed for educational purposes and that the owner is willing to convey the other property to the County for the Board of Education in exchange for the school property, then the parties may exchange the property after the Board of Education has received approval of the property exchange from the State Superintendent of Schools, the interagency committee for school construction (IAC) and any other State agencies which must consent to the property transfer.

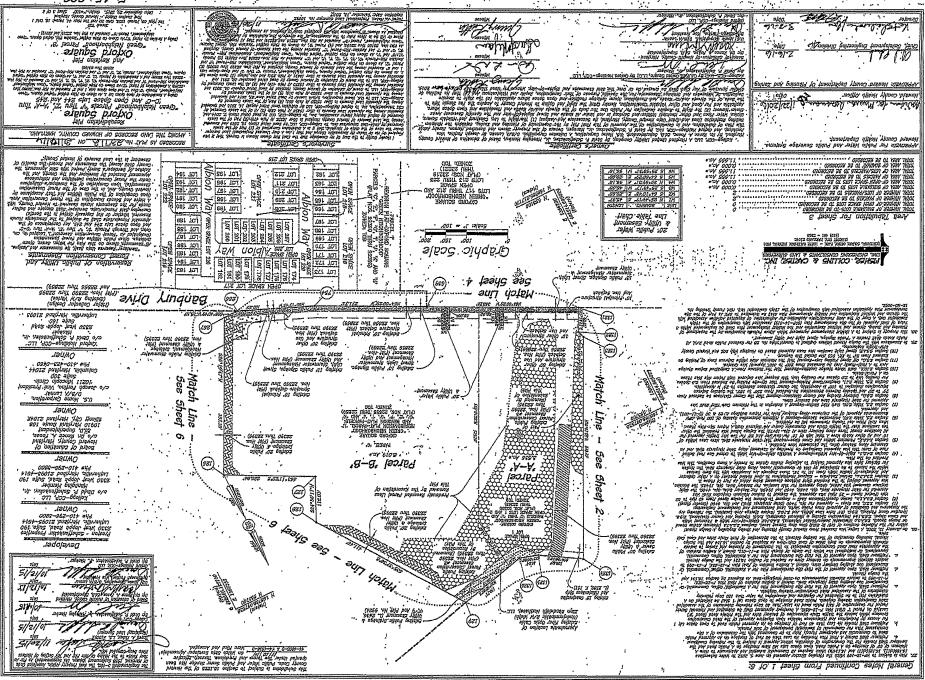
Section 4.203 further provides that the property transfer may take place provided that the County Executive agrees to the proposed transfer and the County Council approves the transfer by resolution.

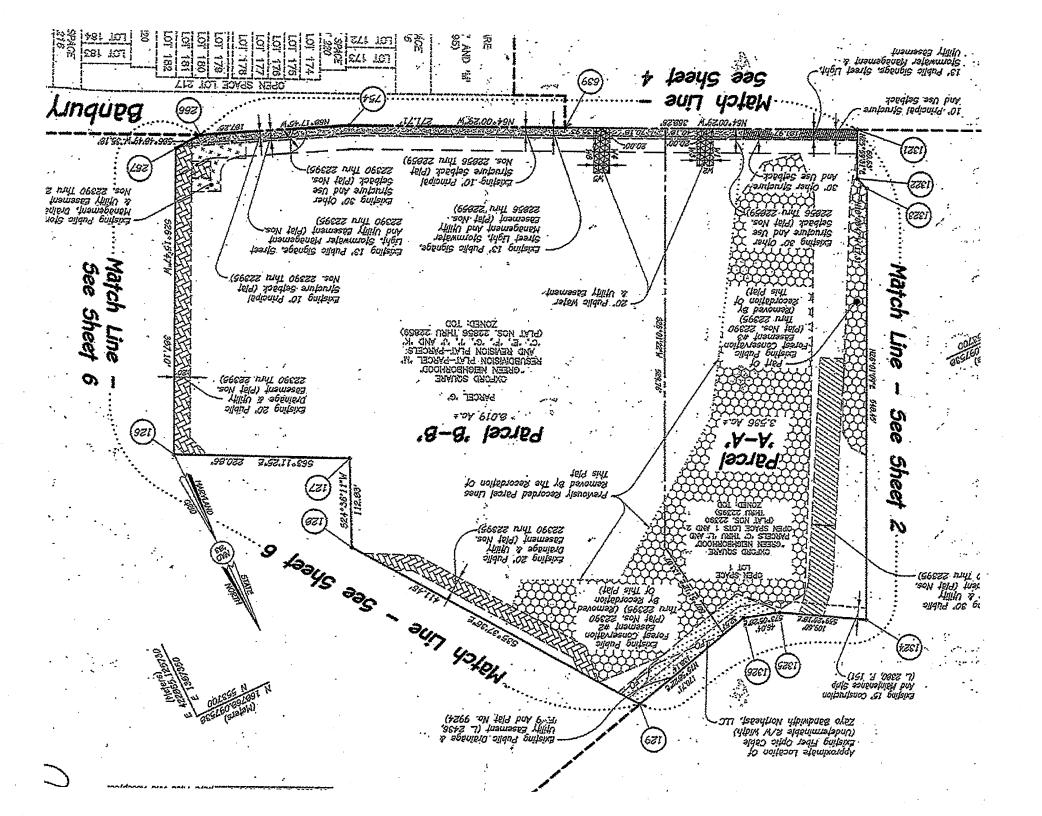

Dear Ms. Sager and Ms. Feldmark,

This is to transmit for County Council notification the intent of the School Board to enter into the property exchange referenced in the attached deeds, subject to any additional review and comment by the parties or County Office of Law. This notice, being pursuant to Section 4-115 of the Education Article of Maryland Code, follows the Board of Education approval of this land exchange at a public meeting on April 14, 2016. The IAC is also scheduled to approve this exchange the morning of April 21, 2016.

A. WAIVER OF EMERGENCY SHELTER COMPLIANCE REQUIREMENT

1. WICOMICO COUNTY PUBLIC SCHOOLS: West Salisbury Elementary Replacement Project

Background

IAC Regulations require that for all school construction projects that include replacing or upgrading the electrical system, local officials shall consult with the Maryland Emergency Management Agency (MEMA) to determine the areas of the school that may be designated for public shelter use in the event of a federal, state, or local emergency. COMAR 23.03.02.29. On April 17, 2014, the IAC approved final Procedures that implement the requirements of the regulation.

Wicomico County Public Schools (WCPS) has a funding request in the FY 2017 Capital Improvement Program (CIP) for a Replacement project at West Salisbury Elementary School. On March 15, 2016 MEMA conducted a site visit with the LEA and determined areas of the facility for public sheltering if events required the use for emergency services. However, in a letter dated March 29, 2016, WCPS requested that the facility not be required to comply with the Emergency Shelter Compliance determination. Local emergency management (LEM) officials have determined that because of the proposed size of the replacement school, it will not be used for emergency sheltering purposes.

Recommendation for Waiver

The IAC has the authority to waive regulatory requirements if the waiver is not inconsistent with State statutes and if a) "application of the regulation in a specific case or in an emergency situation would be inequitable or contrary to the purpose of State law;" and b) the Office of the Attorney General approves the waiver for form and legal sufficiency. COMAR 23.03.02.27.

The Designees recommend that the IAC waive the requirement for Emergency Shelter Compliance for the West Salisbury Elementary Replacement project. The request for waiver has been approved for legal sufficiency by the Office of the Attorney General.

2. SOMERSET COUNTY PUBLIC SCHOOLS: Crisfield High School Renovation/Addition Project

Background

IAC Regulations require that for all school construction projects that include replacing or upgrading the electrical system, local officials shall consult with the Maryland Emergency Management Agency (MEMA) to determine the areas of the school that may be designated for public shelter use in the event of a federal, state, or local emergency. COMAR 23.03.02.29. On April 17, 2014, the IAC approved final Procedures that implement the requirements of the regulation.

Somerset County Public Schools (SCPS) has a funding request in the FY 2017 Capital Improvement Program (CIP) for a Renovation/Addition project at Crisfield High School. On October 23, 2015 MEMA conducted a site visit with the LEA. On December 16, 2015 MEMA determined areas of the facility for public sheltering if events required the use for emergency services. However, in a recent letter dated April 6, 2016, SCPS requested that the facility not be required to comply with the Emergency Shelter Compliance determination. The LEA indicated that after further design review, the requirements for compliance by MEMA would have a significant impact on the overall budget of the project. The area outside of the scope of the renovation and addition project that would be affected by compliance with the requirement is 2-1/2 times larger than the area of the original project. In effect, compliance with the emergency shelter requirement would transform this project into a scope different from that approved by the Board of Education, the County Commissioners, and the Board of Public Works.

Recommendation for Waiver

The IAC has the authority to waive regulatory requirements if the waiver is not inconsistent with State statutes and if a) "application of the regulation in a specific case or in an emergency situation would be inequitable or contrary to the purpose of State law;" and b) the Office of the Attorney General approves the waiver for form and legal sufficiency. COMAR 23.03.02.27.

The Designees recommend that the IAC waive the requirement for Emergency Shelter Compliance for the Crisfield High School Renovation/Addition project. The request for waiver has been approved for legal sufficiency by the Office of the Attorney General.

B. Qualified Zone Academy Bond Program: Approval of the Fiscal Year 2017 Preliminary Allocations

The Qualified Zone Academy Bond (QZAB) program provides State funds for projects in schools that meet requirements for issuance of the federal tax-credit QZABs. The funds can be utilized for capital improvements, repairs, maintenance, and deferred maintenance at existing school buildings. These funds may also be used to fund controlled access systems that allow school staff to lock facility doors and control visitor access. As in prior fiscal years, in the *Administrative Procedures* for the FY 2017 Qualified Zone Academy Bond program, the IAC staff encourages LEAs to examine their security needs for every project in which it is reasonably feasible to carry out the named security enhancements.

The Federal government authorized \$4,680,000 in tax-credit QZABs for Maryland for 2014. Senate Bill 379 authorizes the sale of these bonds by the State Treasurer, with the program to be administered by the Interagency Committee on School Construction (IAC). Language in the 2016 legislation restricting the use of the proceeds in FY 2017 to costs that were eligible under the rules and regulations governing the program that were in effect on January 1, 2016. Local matching funds otherwise required under Regulation .05 of COMAR 23.03.02 are not required for the capital improvement. However, there is a requirement that a contribution from the private or business sector be obtained that is equal to 10 percent of the cost of the project within 14 years from the QZAB issuance.

For Fiscal Year 2017 a total of \$4,680,000 in funding is available; there are no reverted funds from previous fiscal years in addition to the new FY 2017 authorization. Public school systems can access these funds through the IAC utilizing procedures that were previously developed for the QZAB program. There are approximately 927 schools in all 24 school systems that qualify for this program. Thirteen (13) LEAs submitted applications for FY 2017 funding, and 11 school systems have chosen not to participate in the FY 2017 program (Allegany, Anne Arundel, Caroline, Harford, Howard, Kent, Queen Anne's, Somerset, Talbot, Wicomico, and Worcester County Public Schools).

The FY 2017 QZAB program continues the revised method of funding allocation that was initiated in 2011 for the FY 2012 QZAB program.¹ However, since there are no requests for projects identified by the Maryland State Department of Education as Breakthrough Center Schools, the total allocation of the FY 2017 QZAB funds is made on a competitive basis, involving an assessment of project priority, scope and eligibility.

Based on preliminary review, a tentative list of qualified projects has been developed; the recommended LEA allocations provided below are based on these projects, and the recommended projects are listed in the attachment. All projects recommended in this action are eligible under the criterion established by the authorizing legislation. Further application material is required, in particular evidence to support the 10% private entity contribution that is required by federal law. The IAC staff typically requests submission of this material following the IAC approval of the tentative list of projects and before Board of Public Works approval of the recommended LEA allocations. Upon receipt of the application materials, project eligibility will be confirmed. If a project proves to be ineligible, the staff will request the LEA to re-submit another project or, if no project is submitted, will request the IAC to recommend a reallocation of the LEA's approved funds to other projects in other jurisdictions.

In previous years, QZAB allocations were based on each school district's proportion of pre-1970 building area that had not been renovated and its percentage of students eligible for the Free and Reduced Price Meal program. This formulaic approach resulted in over-allocation of funds to certain LEAs that did not have the administrative capacity to manage the difficult QZAB requirements and under-allocation to LEAs that had projects requiring funds larger than the formula permitted, and it contributed to delays in expending the QZAB funds. As a result, in 2011 the General Assembly approved the revised method of allocation.

C. Design and Planning Professionals on Local School Board Staff

Background

The number of design professionals on the staff of a local board of education is thought to be a measure of the board's internal capacity to perform design reviews and manage complex capital projects. Since 2006, the Designees have tracked this number and reported annually to the Interagency Committee.

Findings

We have seen a slight increase in the numbers of design and construction professional staff members over the years. There were 41 registered architects and professional engineers on board staffs in 2006, and there are 46 now. There are also 20 individuals with U.S. Green Building Council certifications for Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED) and seven (7) members of the American Institute of Certified Planners.

In this year's survey we asked also whether the school system had a "sustainable schools" coordinator dedicated to maintaining "green and healthy" schools. The number of environmental issues faced by local school systems each year requires an increasing amount of staff time. Incidents such as mold in schools and lead in drinking water require close coordination among planners, designers, construction managers, building maintenance managers, and environmental safety specialists. Five school systems reported having an employee dedicated to energy coordination, but no school systems have a "sustainable schools" coordinator.

Since the last report, Prince George's County Public Schools has added one (1) registered architect and Frederick County Public Schools added one (1) individual accredited with the American Institute of Certified Planners (AICP). There was no change in the number of design and planning professionals on the staff of Baltimore City Public Schools. The overall deficiency in the number of professionals in the Design and Construction Division of City Schools remains a concern and has been reflected in the reduced number of systemic renovation projects recommended by staff for approval in the FY17 CIP. This aligns with City School's effort to undertake somewhat larger systemic renovation projects of more comprehensive scope rather than a multitude of smaller projects. (Maryland Stadium Authority staff associated with City Schools' 21st Century Building Program is not included in this report.)

In 2013 twelve (12) school systems had no registered architects or engineers on staff. This year only nine (9) school systems have no licensed staff members and rely on consultants and State professionals for project analysis and design review.

For comparison with the State agencies assigned to the IAC:

- PSCP has two (2) registered architects;
- MSDE has three (3) registered architects; and
- DGS (Schools & Community Colleges Unit) has one (1) registered architect and on-call consultants.
- There are no AICP members or LEED certified professionals on the State school construction staff.

The following table shows the number of professionals in each LEA based on a survey conducted in the fall of 2015.

D. Prototype Design Use in Maryland Public School Construction

Background

The Public School Construction Program encourages local education agencies (LEAs) to repeat recently-used school designs, when educationally appropriate and cost effective, within each county and across local school system boundaries as required by the Annotated Code of Maryland, Education Article, §5-309. Since 2008 PSCP staff has submitted an annual report to the IAC on the number and kinds of prototype schools in development.

Findings

There has been strong interest across the State in the use of repeat designs during 2015 as a construction cost containment strategy. School systems typically find some savings in architectural and engineering design fees for the building and in the time required to produce and review construction documents. Each site, however, requires original engineering design and permitting. Reuse of a school design also permits the school system to incorporate design refinements identified during the construction and occupancy of the first school. The following table summarizes the current and projected use of prototype designs in Maryland's 24 public school systems based on the six-year capital improvement program requests submitted by the LEAs in October 2015.

- An LEA is likely to reuse a recently-used school design when it is planning to build multiple schools with the same grade configuration in the next six (6) years.
- Eleven (11) schools using repeat designs are currently in design or under construction in six (6) LEAs.
- Eight (8) LEAs will use, or are likely to use, prototype designs in the next six (6) years.
- Eleven (11) LEAs have only one new school of a unique type planned for the next six (6) years and are unlikely to develop a new prototype.
- Five (5) LEAs have no new or replacement schools planned in the next six (6) years.

E. Relocatable Classrooms in Maryland Public Schools

In school year 2015–2016, there are 2,814 relocatable classrooms in use for instruction in Maryland's 24 local school systems. The total is a 125 classroom decrease from school year 2014-2015. Six (6) school systems reported increases; twelve (12) reported decreases.

Prince George's and Montgomery County Public Schools are using the most relocatable classrooms, 519 and 457 respectively. These are the only school systems with more than 300 relocatables in use. Calvert, Montgomery, Prince George's, and Queen Anne's County school systems each decreased their inventory by more than 20 classrooms from last year.

Approximately 92% of the classrooms are used for general purpose and special subject instruction due to overcrowding in permanent facilities. The remainder is used for temporary capacity during major construction projects.

Over the past four years, Maryland's total public school enrollment has grown approximately 2%, an increase of just under 20,000 students. Although school systems are continuing to construct new schools and classroom additions, the need for relocatable classrooms to supplement permanent space will remain well into the future.

Assuming 23 students per classroom, approximately 64,700 Maryland students are currently accommodated in relocatable classrooms. This is 7% of the total public school enrollment. The school system with the greatest percentage of students in relocatable classrooms is Charles County Public Schools at 22%.

A table showing the number of relocatable classrooms in use for instruction in each school system follows.

State-owned Relocatables

The State owns only 130 of the relocatable classrooms in use. These are sited at specific schools at the request of the local board of education for a minimum of two (2) years. Currently 118 classrooms are in use for instruction, 10 are vacant, and two (2) are used for non-instructional purposes. The Public School Construction Program (PSCP) has not purchased any new classrooms since 1990. The PSCP provides up to \$50,000 toward the relocation of any unit. In addition a limited amount of State funding, subject to the State-local cost share formula, is available each year for maintenance and repair of the State-owned classrooms.

When a school system no longer needs one of the State-owned units, the PSCP conducts a physical inspection. Classrooms that are useable may remain in their location with the agreement of the school system until another user is identified. Classrooms that can no longer be used are declared surplus, offered to other State or local government agencies, or are demolished in accordance with Department of General Services regulations. Three (3) State-owned classrooms in Somerset County were demolished in 2015 and Caroline County has requested demolition of another. A detailed inventory of the State-owned units is available on request.

F. <u>Capital Improvement Program (CIP)</u>: <u>Approval of Recommendations for the Fiscal Year 2017 Capital Improvement Program</u>

Attached for your consideration are the Designees' planning and funding recommendations for the Fiscal Year 2017 Public School Construction Capital Improvement Program (CIP) for a total of \$367.6 million, inclusive of both regular CIP funding and supplemental funding under the Capital Grant Program for Local School Systems with Significant Enrollment Growth or Relocatable Classrooms (EGRC).

FY 2017 Public School Construction Program

Requests for FY 2017 were submitted by 22 LEAs and the Maryland School for the Blind for a total of \$599.2 million, consisting of a total of 263 projects, as well as requests for planning approval for 53 projects. The recommendations will provide funding for a total of 209 projects and include 20 planning approvals, consisting of:

The recommendations are based on an assessment of each LEA's eligible project requests; the allocations approved by the Board of Public Works on January 27, 2016 and the recommendations approved by the IAC on February 18, 2016; each LEA's backlog of previously approved projects; and each LEA's capacity to carry out approved projects.

The Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loan (MCCBL) of 2016 restricts the use of the funds in FY 2017 to costs that were eligible under the rules and regulations governing the program that were in effect on January 1, 2016. All projects recommended in this action are eligible under the criterion established by the MCCBL.

Supplemental Capital Grant Program for Local School Systems with Significant Enrollment Growth or Relocatable Classrooms (EGRC).

The Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loan (MCCBL) of 2016 includes \$40 million for local school systems with high enrollment growth or a large number of relocatable classrooms. These funds are intended to be allocated over and above any other funds that the eligible school system will receive through the Capital Improvement Program.

In addition to the new FY 2017 funds, funds in the total amount of \$13.1 remain available for certain LEAs from the FY 2016 EGRC, for a combined total of \$53.1 million (of the \$20 million FY 2016 EGRC allocation, \$6.9 million was assigned to two projects in summer of 2015).

The Designees recommend additional funding in the amount of \$43.4 million for six (6) LEAs from the EGRC, consisting of \$13.1 million in FY 2016 EGRC funds and \$30.3 million in FY 2017 EGRC funds. The following chart outlines the current status of the FY 2016 and FY 2017 EGRC allocations:

- Dorchester County Public Schools: DCPS tailored the FY 2017 CIP request for a single project, the replacement of North Dorchester High School, in an expectation of receiving \$179,000 in FY 2016 EGRC funds and \$179,000 in FY 2017 EGRC funds. By agreement with the IAC staff and in recognition of the State's funding constraints, DCPS will evenly distribute its annual funding requests over four fiscal years (FY 2017 through FY 2020). At the time of submission, DCPS had no foreknowledge that the FY 2017 EGRC would be double the amount approved for FY 2016; if it had known this, it is likely that it would have requested a larger allocation in FY 2017 in order to avoid a reduction in the new bond allocation. Consequently, DCPS has requested that the FY 2017 additional \$178,000 be reserved for the FY 2018 CIP.
- Prince George's County Public Schools: PGCPS submitted four major projects as high priorities in the FY 2017 CIP, with a total State request of \$20.6 million out of a total CIP request of \$71.5 million. However, as none of the four projects has proceeded to design as quickly as envisioned, they cannot be recommended for funding approval. Four other projects that were completed in the early 2000s can only be funded using general funds, and are therefore ineligible for either regular CIP or EGRC funds. The result is that PGCPS does not have sufficient eligible projects in the FY 2017 CIP to access any portion of the FY 2017 EGRC; the FY 2016 EGRC for this school system was included in the IAC's February 18, 2016 90% recommendations. Should any of the four major projects become eligible prior to the submission of the FY 2018 CIP in October of 2016, we will consider submitting an amendment to the FY 2017 CIP.

E. FUNDING AMENDMENTS

1. Capital Improvement Program Amendments

a) Amendment to the FY 2015 and FY 2016 CIP, Baltimore City Public Schools

The West Baltimore Building #080 HVAC project (PSC #30.237.15 SR) was approved for funding in the FY 2015 CIP in the amount of \$6,000,000 and the Commodore John Rodgers #027 Fire Safety/Sprinkler project (PSC #30.017.16 SR) was approved for funding in the FY 2016 CIP in the amount of \$400,000, for a total of \$6,400,000.

In a letter dated April 5, 2016, Baltimore City Public Schools (BCPSS) requested that both of these projects be rescinded for the following reasons:

West Baltimore Building #080 HVAC (PSC #30.237.15 SR)

This building is currently used as a designated swing space. The recommendation is to close the building in 2024, as listed in Exhibit 6 of the *Memorandum of Understanding for the Construction and Revitalization of Baltimore City Public Schools* (MOU). It is not an efficient use of scarce State and local resources to make a capital investment in a building that may no longer be in the City Schools' portfolio within a short period of time.

Commodore John Rodgers #027 Fire Safety/Sprinkler (PSC #30.017.16 SR)

The new Director of Design and Construction has recommended that the project be deferred, as the cost estimate is inconsistent with the scope of work required for this project. Baltimore City Public Schools will resubmit this project in the FY 2018 CIP.

The Designees recommend that the Interagency Committee on School Construction approve the rescission of funding for the HVAC project at the West Baltimore Building #080 as an amendment to the FY 2015 CIP and the Fire Safety/Sprinkler project at Commodore John Rodgers #027 as an amendment to the FY 2016 CIP. If approved, the State allocations for these projects will decrease in total from \$6,400,000 to \$0 and the total amount of \$6,400,000 will be reverted to the Statewide Contingency Account reserved for Baltimore City.

Brunswick Middle – Roof Replacement PSC #10.055.11/15 SR

Frederick County Public Schools (FCPS) has indicated that an Energy Rebate was received in the amount of \$4,419 for the Roof replacement project at Brunswick Middle. Based on this rebate, an analysis has been performed to determine if there should be a revision to the eligible State participation in the original contract approval awarded to Cole Roofing, Inc.

This analysis has determined that there should be a reduction to the total eligible State participation in the contract from \$241,499 to \$238,847, a reduction of the contingency for change orders from \$6,037 to \$5,971, and an increase to the State funds reverted from \$143,464 to \$146,182.
