9 **SECTION 22.900. DEFINITIONS.**

10 FOR PURPOSES OF THIS SUBTITLE, THE FOLLOWING TERMS HAVE THE MEANINGS INDICATED:

11 (A) *DEADLINE* MEANS THE LAST DAY OF ANY PERIOD OF TIME BY WHICH ANY PERSON OR COUNTY
12 DEPARTMENT OR AGENCY IS REQUIRED TO TAKE SOME ACTION.

13 ~~(B) *HOLIDAY* MEANS RECOGNIZED COUNTY, STATE, AND FEDERAL HOLIDAYS.~~ (B) *HOLIDAY* MEANS
14 THE HOLIDAYS DESIGNATED BY THE COUNTY'S CHIEF ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICER AND POSTED ON
15 THE COUNTY'S WEBSITE."

16 (C) *ORDINARY BUSINESS HOURS* MEANS 8 A.M. TO 5 P.M. ON MONDAY THROUGH FRIDAY.

19 THIS SUBTITLE APPLIES TO ANY DEADLINE ESTABLISHED BY THIS CODE THAT EXCEEDS SEVEN

22 **SECTION 22.902. COMPUTATION OF TIME.**

23 (A) *BEGINNING OF THE PERIOD OF TIME.* IN COMPUTING ANY PERIOD OF TIME ~~PRESCRIBED BY THIS~~
24 SUBJECT TO THIS SUBTITLE CODE, THE DAY OF THE ACT, EVENT, OR DEFAULT, AFTER WHICH THE
25 DESIGNATED PERIOD OF TIME BEGINS TO RUN, IS NOT TO BE INCLUDED.

26 (B) *DEADLINE.* THE DEADLINE IS TO BE COMPUTED AS FOLLOWS:

- 27 (1) IF THE LAST DAY IS A SATURDAY, SUNDAY, OR HOLIDAY, THE DEADLINE SHALL BE
28 THE END OF THE NEXT DAY, WHICH IS NOT A SATURDAY, SUNDAY, OR HOLIDAY; OR
29 (2) IF THE COUNTY OFFICE IS NOT OPEN ON THE LAST DAY OF THE PERIOD, OR IS CLOSED
30 FOR A PART OF A DAY, THE DEADLINE SHALL BE THE END OF THE NEXT DAY WHICH

3 (II) A DAY ON WHICH THE COUNTY OFFICE IS OPEN THE ENTIRE DAY DURING
