AN ACT for the purpose of authorizing and empowering Howard County, Maryland to borrow money in the principal amount of up to \$45,918,993 \$50,918,993 on its full faith and credit, and issue and sell its bonds or other obligations therefor, to be used to pay costs of certain County water and sewer capital projects which are specified and described in the County's 2017 Capital Budget (including, without limitation, borrowings for certain water and sewer capital projects previously authorized in prior calendar years which such authorization has lapsed or will lapse), and to pay costs of issuance of such bonds or other obligations; authorizing the County to issue bond anticipation notes or to enter into installment purchase agreements for payment of portions of such costs; and to levy taxes upon the assessable property within the County sufficient, together with benefit assessments, ad valorem taxes levied upon the assessable property in the Metropolitan District and other available funds, to pay the debt service on such obligations; and providing for and determining various matters in connection therewith.

### Recitals

In accordance with the provisions of Section 603 of the Charter of Howard County, Maryland (the "Charter"), the County Executive has submitted a proposed Capital Budget for fiscal year 2017 to the County Council of Howard County, Maryland, and, prior to the passage of this Act, the County Council has adopted a Capital Budget for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2017 (the "Capital Budget").

6 As a part of the Capital Budget, it is necessary that Howard County, Maryland borrow a sum not 7 exceeding \$45,918,993 \$50,918,993 to be used for (i) the financing and refinancing of certain water and 8 sewer capital projects, specified and described in the Capital Budget (each a "Project", collectively, the 9 "Projects"), and more particularly described in Appendix A attached hereto and incorporated herein, and 10 (ii) payment of costs of issuance of any obligations issued to evidence such borrowing. Of such amount, 11 \$11,975,992 appropriated for certain of such Projects was previously authorized to be borrowed by the 12 County during prior calendar years, as indicated in Appendix A in the column captioned "Amount to be 13 Borrowed (Reauthorizations)", but such authorizations are expected to expire prior to the completion of 14 such Projects or the sale of general obligation bonds to provide permanent financing therefor. 15 Accordingly, it is necessary that such borrowing be reauthorized ("Reauthorizations").

### Now therefore, in accordance with the provisions of Article VI of the Charter:

17 Section 1. Be it enacted by the County Council of Howard County, Maryland, That Howard 18 County, Maryland (the "County"), is hereby authorized and empowered to borrow on its full faith and 19 credit, and issue and sell its bonds or other obligations therefor, at one time or from time to time, an 20 amount not exceeding \$45,918,993 \$50,918,993 the proceeds thereof to be used to finance and refinance 21 the Projects more particularly specified and described in Appendix A attached hereto and in the Capital 22 Budget; including for each Project, without limitation, the cost of planning, design, construction, 23 reconstruction, furnishing, equipping, improvements, rehabilitation, remodeling, enlargements, 24 engineering services, architects services, surveys, landscaping, site development, evaluation studies, land 25 acquisition and related items, appurtenances and incidental activities. The Projects and the amount to be

borrowed for each (including, without limitation, any Reauthorizations), are more specifically identified 1 2 and described in Appendix A attached hereto.

Proceeds of any bonds or other obligations authorized by this Act may also be used to pay costs 4 of issuance of such bonds or other obligations.

5 Section 2. And be it further enacted by the County Council of Howard County, Maryland, That, pursuant to and in accordance with Section 19-212 of the Local Government Article of the 6 7 Annotated Code of Maryland, as amended, the County is also authorized to issue bond anticipation notes in anticipation of the issuance of the bonds or other obligations authorized by this Act and described in 8 9 Section 1 hereof, and all references to "bonds" or "obligations" in this Act shall include such bond 10 anticipation notes, unless the context clearly requires a contrary meaning. It is intended that the aggregate 11 principal amount of issued and outstanding bond anticipation notes when added to the aggregate principal amount of issued and outstanding bonds in anticipation of which such notes were issued, shall not exceed 12 the aggregate principal amount set forth in Section 1 of this Act at any time. The County will agree in 13 each ordinance described in Section 4 of this Act relating to any notes issued pursuant to this Act to pay 14 such notes and the interest and premium, if any, thereon from the proceeds of the bonds in anticipation of 15 the sale of which such notes are issued, and the County will agree to issue such bonds when, and as soon 16 17 as, the reason for deferring their issuance no longer exists.

Section 3. And be it further enacted by the County Council of Howard County, Maryland, 18 That, in connection with the acquisition of real property as part of a Project, the County may incur all or 19 any portion of the indebtedness authorized by this Act for such acquisition by entering into an installment 20 purchase agreement pursuant to and in accordance with Section 4.201A of the Howard County Code 21 ("Section 4.201A") or any successor provisions of law in lieu of issuing bonds or other obligations for 22 23 such acquisition. The principal amount of any such installment purchase agreement shall not exceed the lesser of (a) the maximum principal amount permitted by Section 4.201A or (b) the portion of the amount 24 to be borrowed for such Project (as set forth in Section 1 hereof) which relates to such acquisition. All 25

1 references to "bonds" or "obligations" in this Act shall include such installment purchase agreements. 2 unless the context clearly requires a contrary meaning.

3

Section 4. And be it further enacted by the County Council of Howard County, Maryland, 4 That the County Council of Howard County, by an ordinance or ordinances adopted from time to time in 5 accordance with Article VI of the Charter and other applicable provisions of law and policies of the 6 County, shall provide for (a) the issuance and sale of, (b) the maximum principal amount, designation, 7 form, tenor and denomination or denominations of, (c) the dates of the first maturity and the last maturity 8 (not more than 30 years after the date of issue) of, and (d) the interest rate or rates per annum (or the 9 method of determining such rate or rates) payable on, any bonds or other obligations issued from time to 10 time under this Act; and may by any such ordinance, or by separate resolution, provide that the issue of 11 bonds or other obligations hereby authorized be consolidated with one or more other issues.

12 Section 5. And be it further enacted by the County Council of Howard County, Maryland, 13 That for the purpose of paying the principal of and interest on such bonds or other obligations as the same 14 shall become payable, the County Council of Howard County shall levy ad valorem taxes upon assessable 15 property in the Metropolitan District and other available funds, together with benefit assessments, to pay 16 the principal of and interest on such bonds or other obligations until all of such bonds or other obligations 17 shall mature and be redeemed. In the event of a deficiency of such funds at any time while any of such 18 Metropolitan District Bonds are outstanding, for the purpose of paying the principal of and interest on 19 such bonds, the County shall promptly levy upon all legally assessable property within the Metropolitan 20 District a tax or taxes in an amount or amounts sufficient to make up any such deficiency, and in the event 21 the proceeds of such tax or taxes so levied shall prove insufficient, then the County shall levy ad valorem 22 taxes upon all of the legally assessable property within the entire corporate limits of the County in rate and amount sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such bonds. The full faith and credit and 23 24 unlimited taxing power of the County are hereby irrevocably pledged to the payment of the principal of 25 and interest on such bonds.

Section 6. And be it further enacted by the County Council of Howard County, Maryland,
 That any bonds or other obligations issued from time to time under this Act are specifically exempt from
 the provisions of Sections 19-205 and 19-206 of the Annotated Code of Maryland, as amended, and any
 successor provision of law.

5 Section 7. And be it further enacted by the County Council of Howard County, Maryland, 6 That all bonds or other obligations authorized hereby shall be issued within four years from the date this 7 Act becomes effective. Notwithstanding the foregoing, if bond anticipation notes are issued within such 8 period in accordance with <u>Section 2</u> hereof, the bonds authorized hereby may be issued until the final 9 maturity date of such notes.

10 Section 8. And be it further enacted by the County Council of Howard County, Maryland, 11 That the County anticipates that a portion of the costs of some or all of the Projects may be paid prior to 12 the issuance of the bonds or other obligations authorized hereby. The amount of such costs so paid will 13 depend on various factors, including, without limitation, the timing and speed of progress on the Projects, 14 the availability of other funds to pay such costs on an interim basis, bond and money market conditions 15 and compliance with federal and State laws and regulations.

Accordingly, the County reasonably expects to reimburse costs of the Projects (as described herein) with proceeds of the bonds or other obligations authorized hereby, such bonds or other obligations to be issued by the County in the maximum principal amount of \$45,918,993 \$50,918,993.

Section 9. And be it further enacted by the County Council of Howard County, Maryland,
 That this Act shall take effect sixty-one (61) days after its enactment.

6 As a part of the Capital Budget, it is necessary that Howard County, Maryland borrow a sum not 7 exceeding \$45,918,993to be used for (i) the financing and refinancing of certain water and sewer capital 8 projects, specified and described in the Capital Budget (each a "Project", collectively, the "Projects"), and 9 more particularly described in Appendix A attached hereto and incorporated herein, and (ii) payment of 10 costs of issuance of any obligations issued to evidence such borrowing. Of such amount, \$11,975,992 11 appropriated for certain of such Projects was previous authorized to be borrowed by the County during 12 prior calendar years, as indicated in Appendix N in the column captioned "Amount to be Borrowed 13 (Reauthorizations)", but such authorizations are expected to expire prior to the completion of such 14 Projects or the sale of general obligation bonds to provide permanent financing therefor. Accordingly, it is 15 necessary that such borrowing be reauthorized ("Reauthorizations").

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## Now therefore, in accordance with the provisions of Article VI of the Charter:

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each (including, without limitation, any Reauthorizations), are more specifically identified and described
 in Appendix A attached hereto.

and the second

Proceeds of any bonds or other obligations authorized by this Act may also be used to pay costs
of issuance of such bonds or other obligations.

Section 2. And be it further enacted by the County Council of Howard County, Maryland, 5 That, pursuant to and in accordance with Section 19-212 of the Local Government Article of the 6 Annotated Code of Maryland, as amended, the County is also authorized to issue bond anticipation notes 7 in anticipation of the issuance of the bonds or other obligations authorized by this Act and described in 8 Section 1 hereof, and all references to "bonds" or "obligations" in this Act shall include such bond 9 anticipation notes, unless the context clearly requires a contrary meaning. It is intended that the aggregate 10 principal amount of issued and outstanding bond anticipation notes when added to the aggregate principal 11 amount of issued and outstanding bonds in anticipation of which such notes were issued, shall not exceed 12 the aggregate principal amount set forth in Section 1 of this Act at any time. The County will agree in 13 each ordinance described in Section 4 of this Act relating to any notes issued pursuant to this Act to pay 14 such notes and the interest and premium, if any, thereon from the proceeds of the bonds in anticipation of 15 the sale of which such notes are issued, and the County will agree to issue such bonds when, and as soon 16 17 as, the reason for deferring their issuance no longer exists.

Section 37 And be it further enacted by the County Council of Howard County, Maryland, 18 That, in connection with the acquisition of real property as part of a Project, the County may incur all or 19 any portion of the indebtedness authorized by this Act for such acquisition by entering into an installment 20 purchase agreement pursuant to and in accordance with Section 4.201A of the Howard County Code 21 ("Section 4.201A") or any successor provisions of law in lieu of issuing bonds or other obligations for 22 such acquisition. The principal amount of any such installment purchase agreement shall not exceed the 23 lesser of (a) the maximum principal amount permitted by Section 4.201A or (b) the portion of the amount 24 to be borrowed for such Project (as set forth in Section 1 hereof) which relates to such acquisition. All 25

1 references to "bonds" or "obligations" in this Act shall include such installment purchase agreements, 2 unless the context clearly requires a contrary meaning.

3

Section 4. And be it further enacted by the County Council of Howard County, Maryland, That the County Council of Howard County, by an ordinance or ordinances adopted from time to time in 4 5 accordance with Article VI of the Charter and other applicable provisions of law and policies of the County, shall provide for (a) the issuance and sale of, (b) the maximum principal amount, designation, 6 7 form, tenor and denomination or denominations of, (c) the dates of the first maturity and the last maturity 8 (not more than 30 years after the date of issue) of, and (d) the interest rate or rates per annum (or the method of determining such rate or rates) payable on, any bonds or other obligations issued from time to 9 10 time under this Act; and may by any such ordinance, or by separate resolution, provide that the issue of 11 bonds or other obligations hereby authorized be consolidated with one or more other issues.

Section 5. And be it further enacted by the County Council of Howard County, Maryland, 12 That for the purpose of paying the principal of and interest on such bonds or other obligations as the same 13 shall become payable, the County Council of Howard County shall levy ad valorem taxes upon assessable 14 property in the Metropolitan District and other available funds, together with benefit assessments, to pay 15 the principal of and interest on such bonds or other obligations until all of such bonds or other obligations 16 shall mature and be redeemed. In the event of a deficiency of such funds at any time while any of such 17 Metropolitan District Bonds are outstanding, for the purpose of paying the principal of and interest on 18 such bonds, the County shall promptly levy upon all legally assessable property within the Metropolitan 19 District a tax or taxes in an amount or amounts sufficient to make up any such deficiency, and in the event 20 the proceeds of such tax or taxes so levied shall prove insufficient, then the County shall levy ad valorem 21 22 taxes upon all of the legally assessable property within the entire corporate limits of the County in rate and amount sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such bonds. The full faith and credit and 23 unlimited taxing power of the County are hereby irrevocably pledged to the payment of the principal of 24 25 and interest on such bonds.

Section 6. And be it further enacted by the County Council of Howard County, Maryland,
 That any bonds or other obligations issued from time to time under this Act are specifically exempt from
 the provisions of Sections 19-205 and 19-206 of the Annotated Code of Maryland, as amended, and any
 successor provision of law.

5 Section 7. And be it further enacted by the County Council of Howard County, Maryland, 6 That all bonds or other obligations authorized hereby shall be issued within four years from the date this 7 Act becomes effective. Notwithstanding the foregoing, if bond anticipation notes are issued within such 8 period in accordance with Section 2 hereof, the bonds authorized hereby may be issued until the final 9 maturity date of such notes.

- 10 Section 8. And be it further enacted by the County Council of Howard County, Maryland, 11 That the County anticipates that a portion of the costs of some or all of the Projects may be paid prior to 12 the issuance of the bonds or other obligations authorized hereby. The amount of such costs so paid will 13 depend on various factors, including, without limitation, the timing and speed of progress on the Projects, 14 the availability of other funds to pay such costs on an interim basis, bond and money market conditions 15 and compliance with federal and State laws and regulations.
- Accordingly, the County reasonably expects to reimburse costs of the Projects (as described herein) with proceeds of the bonds or other obligations authorized hereby, such bonds or other obligations to be issued by the County in the maximum principal amount of \$45,918,993.
- Section 9. And be it further enacted by the County Council of Howard County, Maryland,
   That this Act shall take effect sixty-one (61) days after its enactment.

The proposed legislation will authorize the County to issue bonds to finance certain capital projects as well as re-authorize lapsing bond authorizations. Council Bill 29-2016 will authorize the issuance of \$102,021,000 of General Obligation bonds and re-authorize \$23,082,033 of General Obligation bonds. Council Bill 30-2016 will authorize the issuance of \$33,943,000 of Metropolitan District (water and sewer) bonds and re-authorize \$11,975,992 of bonds. Council Bill 31-2016 will authorize the issuance of \$18,955,000 of Road Excise tax supported bonds and re-authorize \$13,391,180 of bonds. Council Bill 32-2016 will authorize the issuance of \$2,000,000 of School Surcharge supported bonds. Council Bill 33-2016 will authorize a capital lease of \$11,400,000 to finance the acquisition of portable radios and fleet fuel site upgrades. All of the projects included in the proposed legislation are part of the FY 2017 Capital Budget.
