Council Resolution 181-2016 – Introduced by Calvin Ball: A RESOLUTION calling on the Equal Business Opportunity Commission to make certain studies related to the County's Equal Business

Opportunity Program and purchasing practices, to study polices and experiences of other jurisdictions with respect to contracting and purchasing and the use of businesses owned by women, minorities, and individuals with disabilities; to recommend to the County Council measures to improve the County's purchasing policies and practices; and generally relating to fostering equal business opportunities for businesses owned by women, minorities, and individuals with disabilities in Howard County.

Council Bill 70-2016 – Introduced by Mary Kay Sigaty: AN ACT establishing a special, non-lapsing Reserve Fund for Permanent Public Improvements; specifying the components, purposes, and uses of the Fund; providing a limit on the size of annual payments to the Fund; and generally relating to financing public improvements in the County.

Council Bill 71-2016 (ZRA 167) – Introduced at the request of Elisa Kamens; AN ACT amending the Howard County Zoning Regulations Conditional Use section to clarify that indoor noises at Pet Day Care Facilities Conditional Uses must not be detectible at the lot lines; and generally relating to Pet Day Care Facilities Conditional Uses.

Council Bill 72-2016 (ZRA 168) – Introduced at the request of Demirel Plaza, Inc.: AN ACT amending the Howard County Zoning Regulations Office Transition (OT) section to add several new uses to be allowed as a matter of right; amending the Conditional Use section to allow Child Day Care Centers and Nursery Schools, Day Treatment and Care Facilities and Pet Day Care Facilities as Conditional Uses in the Office Transition (OT) district; and generally relating to the Office Transition (OT) section.

Council Bill 73-2016 – AN ACT for the purpose of authorizing and empowering Howard County, Maryland to borrow money an additional aggregate principal amount of up to \$1,700,000 on its full faith and credit, and issue and sell its bonds therefor, to be used to pay costs of various capital projects, more particularly described in the County's 2017 Capital Budget, and to pay costs of issuance of such bonds; authorizing the County to issue bond anticipation notes or to enter into installment purchase agreements for payment of portions of such costs; and to levy taxes upon the assessable property within the County sufficient, together with other available funds, to pay the debt service on such obligations; and providing for and determining various matters in connection therewith.

Council Bill 74-2016 – AN ACT amending the age of eligibility for the property tax credit for senior citizens; making certain technical corrections; and generally related to the real property tax credit for senior citizens.

Council Bill 75-2016 AN ACT establishing a tax credit against the County tax imposed on real property that is owned by individuals who are at least 65 years of age and have lived in the same dwelling for the preceding 40 years or who are at least 65 years of age and a retired member of the Armed Forces of the United States, under certain conditions; establishing the amount, terms, conditions, and duration of the credit; providing for an application procedure and administration of the credit; and generally relating to real property tax credits.

Council Bill 76-2016 – AN ACT approving and providing for a multi-year Installment Purchase Agreement by Howard County, Maryland to acquire development rights in approximately 29.62 acres of agricultural land located at 3844 Jennings Chapel Road, Woodbine, Howard County, Maryland, from the John J. and Beatrice H. Iglehart Living Trust or any other owner thereof for a maximum purchase price of \$797,400.00 or, if less, not more than \$26,921.00 per acre or portion thereof, rounded to the next highest \$100, plus interest on the deferred portion of such purchase price; providing that the County's obligation to pay such purchase price and interest on the deferred

portion of such purchase price shall be a full faith and credit general obligation of the County; providing for the levying of taxes for such payments; authorizing the County Executive to modify such Agreement; and providing for and determining various matters in connection therewith.

Council Bill 77-2016 – AN ACT approving and providing for a multi-year Installment Purchase Agreement by Howard County, Maryland to acquire development rights in approximately 166.82 acres of agricultural land located at 15325 Leondina Drive, Glenwood, Howard County, Maryland, from Cattail Meadows, LLC or any other owner thereof for a maximum purchase price of \$6,584,100.00 or, if less, not more than \$39,468.00 per acre or portion thereof, rounded to the next highest \$100, plus interest on the deferred portion of such purchase price; providing that the County's obligation to pay such purchase price and interest on the deferred portion of such purchase price shall be a full faith and credit general obligation of the County; providing for the levying of taxes for such payments; authorizing the County Executive to modify such Agreement; and providing for and determining various matters in connection therewith.

Council Bill 78-2016 – AN ACT approving and providing for a multi-year Installment Purchase Agreement by Howard County, Maryland to acquire development rights in approximately 109.07 acres of agricultural land located at 755 East Watersville Road, Mt. Airy, Howard County, Maryland, from the Stanley Matthew Pickett Revocable Trust or any other owner thereof for a maximum purchase price of \$3,404,600.00 or, if less, not more than \$31,214.40 per acre or portion thereof, rounded to the next highest \$100, plus interest on the deferred portion of such purchase price; providing that the County's obligation to pay such purchase price and interest on the deferred portion of such purchase price shall be a full faith and credit general obligation of the County; providing for the levying of taxes for such payments; authorizing the County Executive to modify such Agreement; and providing for and determining various matters in connection therewith.

Council Bill 79-2016 – Introduced by Jon Weinstein and Calvin Ball: AN Act requiring that the Howard County Design Manual Volume I (Storm Drainage) be used for a specified purpose; mandating a specified figure for rainfall for certain 100 year storms; requiring certain periodic reviews; providing that this Act shall apply to a specified area at a specified time; generally relating to stormwater management in Howard County; and making this Act an emergency measure.

Council Bill 43-2016 – Introduced by Jennifer Terrasa; AN ACT amending the Downtown Columbia Plan to establish an Affordable Housing Inclusionary Zoning provision for Downtown Columbia, under certain conditions; amending certain Community Enhancements, Programs, and Public Amenities (CEPPAs) requirements regarding affordable housing; and generally relating to planning, zoning and land use in Howard County. (tabled 7/29/16)

Council Bill 44-2016 (ZRA 162) – Introduced by Jennifer Terrasa; AN ACT amending the Howard County Zoning Regulations' New Town (NT) District Downtown Revitalization regulations to include a 15 percent Affordable Housing Inclusionary Zoning provision for Downtown Columbia, under certain conditions; and generally relating to the NT District. (tabled 7/29/16)

Council Bill 45-2016 – Introduced by Jennifer Terrasa; AN ACT amending the Howard County Code's Downtown Columbia provisions regarding affordable housing payments required by Community Enhancements, Programs, and Public Amenities (CEPPAs) to reflect an inclusionary zoning provision for Downtown Columbia; and generally relating to affordable housing in Downtown Columbia. (tabled 7/29/16)

Council Bill 52-2016 – AN ACT amending the *Downtown Columbia Plan*, a General Plan Amendment, to revise the Downtown Columbia affordable housing program; setting forth methods for the development of affordable housing; revising the Downtown Revitalization Phasing Progression to reflect the timing of affordable housing development; amending certain Community Enhancements, Programs and Public Amenities to reflect the methods for the development of affordable housing; and generally relating to planning, zoning and land use in Howard County. (tabled 7/29/16)

Council Bill 53-2016 – AN ACT amending *PlanHoward 2030*, the general plan for Howard County, in order to amend the number of housing unit allocations available to developers of new residential units in Downtown Columbia for the period 2015 - 2030; and generally relating to planning, zoning and land use in Howard County. (tabled 7/29/16)

Council Bill 54-2016 (ZRA 170) – AN ACT requiring a new configuration of affordable housing in Downton Columbia under certain conditions with certain alternatives; amending and providing for certain parking requirements related to residential units in Downtown Columbia; providing certain requirements for certain plans; requiring that certain types of construction provide for art in the community; and generally relating to the Howard County Zoning Regulations. (tabled 7/29/16)

Council Bill 55-2016 – AN ACT amending the County Code by clarifying that certain moderate income housing units are provided in certain Zoning Districts as required by the Howard County Zoning Regulations or when required by certain plans; exempting Downtown Columbia from a certain provision of the Adequate Public Facilities Ordinance; amending certain payments for affordable housing required by each developer of residential property within Downtown Columbia under certain conditions; and generally relating to development in Downtown Columbia. (tabled 7/29/16)

Council Resolution 103-2016 – A RESOLUTION approving and authorizing the execution of a Development Rights and Responsibilities Agreement by Howard Research And Development Corporation and Howard County in accordance with Title 16, Subtitle 17 of the Howard County Code; authorizing the Executive to make changes to the Agreement, under certain conditions; authorizing the County Executive to execute the Agreement; providing for the effective date of this Resolution, and generally relating to the Agreement. (tabled 7/29/16)

Council Resolution 104-2016 – A RESOLUTION pursuant to Section 4.201 of the Howard County Code, authorizing the County Executive's sale of certain real property known as the "Flier Building" owned by Howard County, Maryland, containing approximately 2.159 acres, and located at 10750 Little Patuxent Parkway, Maryland; waiving the advertising and bidding requirements of Section 4.201 of the Howard County Code; and providing that the County Executive is not bound to sell the property if he finds that it may have a further public use. (tabled 7/29/16)

Council Resolution 105-2016 – A RESOLUTION adopted pursuant to Sections 12-201 et seq. of the Economic Development Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland (the "Tax Increment Financing Act") and Sections 21-501 et seq. of the Local Government Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland (the "Special Taxing District Act", and collectively with the Tax Increment Financing Act, the "Acts") providing for the designation of contiguous property in the downtown Columbia area of Howard County as a development district for purposes of the Tax Increment Financing Act (the "Development District") and for the designation of a separate area within the development district as a special taxing district for the purposes of the Special Taxing District Act (the "Special Taxing District", and collectively with the Development District, the "Districts"); creating certain special funds pursuant to the Acts; providing for the deposit and use of moneys in such special funds; pledging that the County will allocate and divide property taxes on real property

within the Development District so that the portion of the real property taxes levied on the amount by which the assessable base of the real property in the Development District exceeds the original taxable value (the "Tax Increment") will be allocated and paid into one of the special funds, and providing for the levy and collection of special taxes or ad valorem taxes to be deposited to the other special fund in the event the real property taxes levied on the Tax Increment are or will be insufficient to pay debt service on certain bonds issued under the Acts; and providing for, finding, and determining matters in connection therewith. (tabled 7/29/16)

Council Bill 56-2016 – AN ORDINANCE levying and providing for the collection of a special tax on property within the special taxing district in the downtown Columbia area of Howard County, Maryland known as the "Crescent Special Taxing District" (the "Special Taxing District") pursuant to the Rate and Method identified herein and for various matters relating thereto; authorizing and empowering the County to issue up to \$90,000,000 of its special obligation bonds at a maximum interest rate not to exceed 12% per annum in order to finance or reimburse the cost of certain public improvements relating to the Special Taxing District and the Development District (as defined herein) and other costs permitted under the Acts (as identified herein); providing that such bonds and the interest thereon shall never constitute a general obligation of the County or a pledge of its full faith and credit; providing for the further specification, prescription, determination, provision for or approval of various other matters, details, documents and procedures in connection with the authorization, issuance, security, sale and payment for any such bonds; making certain legislative findings; and generally providing for the levy, imposition, collection and application of such special tax and the issuance of an initial series of bonds in accordance with the Acts identified herein.
