The Chairperson called the legislative session to order at **12:14** p.m. through Virtual *via Webex*.

Diane Schwartz Jones, Administrator to the County Council; Craig Glendenning, County Auditor; Gary Kuc, County Solicitor; Theo Wimberly, Administrative Manager; and Kel Berg, Administrative Support were also present.

CORRECTIVE ACTION

Council Resolution 34-2020 - A RESOLUTION amending the Howard County Board of Education Operating Budget for Fiscal Year 2020 to appropriate \$7,200,000 from its Fiscal Year 2019 unassigned General Fund Balance to its Fiscal Year 2020 Operating Budget Fixed Charges category to reduce its Health Fund Deficit; and generally relating to the Board of Education Operating Budget for Fiscal Year 2020. Council Bill 33-2020 – Introduced by: Liz Walsh, Deb Jung, and Christiana Rigby - AN ACT prohibiting an increase of rent or mobile home park fees, changes in certain lease or rental agreement terms, and certain actions by landlords and mobile home park owners; prohibiting certain notices to tenants and mobile home park residents; requiring certain notices to tenants and mobile home park residents; specifying that the prohibitions and required notices of this Act are operative during and for a specified period after certain proclaimed or declared emergencies; generally relating to landlord-tenant and mobile home park owner – resident relations; and making this Act an Emergency Bill. (*Expires 7/10/20; 8/14/20 if extended; or 9/14/20 if extended twice.*)

The Chairperson moved to approve Council Bill 33-2020. The motion was seconded by Ms. Walsh.

Amendment No. 1

(This Amendment exclude situations where the tenant was in default before the State of *Emergency.*)

(This Amendment provides for a payment plan.)

Amendment No. <u>4</u>

(This Amendment specifies that a landlord or mobile home park owner, during the emergency period, may not propose a modification to a lease or rental agreement that would increase rent or modify a lease or rental agreement unless the tenant or mobile home park resident consents.)

Council Member Rigby moved to withdraw Amendment 4. The motion was seconded by Ms. Jung.

Council Member Rigby moved to approve Amendment 5. The motion was seconded by Ms. Walsh.

Amendment No. <u>5</u>

(This Amendment prohibits late fees during the emergency.)

The roll call vote called by the Administrator on the motion to approve Amendment 5 was: Yea: Council Members Jones, Jung, Rigby, Walsh and Yungmann.

The motion to approve Amendment 5 passed.

Council Member Rigby moved to allow the introduction of Amendment 6, which was not prefiled. The motion was seconded by Ms. Jung.

The roll call vote called by the Administrator on the motion to allow the introduction of Amendment 6 which was not prefiled was: Yea: Council Members Jones, Jung, Rigby, Walsh and Yungmann.

(tabled 4/6/2020 and 5/4/2020) (*Expires 5/11/20; 6/15/20 if extended; or 7/20/20 if extended twice.*)

Council Bill 12-2020 - Introduced by: David Yungmann – AN ACT to allow a landlord to show a model or similar unit to a prospective tenant if the unit to be leased is not vacant under specified circumstances; to repeal the authority of a tenant to terminate a lease without penalty if certain violations are not abated within a certain time; to allow a lease to provide that a tenant will pay specified costs under specified circumstances; to alter the lease payment grace period; to allow for the collection of specified charges; to repeal the prohibition against a lease stating that it is a contract under seal; making a technical correction; and generally relating to landlord-tenant relations. (tabled 4/6/2020) (*Expires 5/11/20; 6/15/20 if extended; or 7/20/20 if extended twice.*)

Council Bill 13-2020 - Introduced by: Christiana Rigby; Co-sponsored by: Opel Jones and Liz Walsh - AN ACT amending the Howard County Code to establish a Notice and a Requirement to provide an offer to the County and Housing Commission to Purchase Rental Housing offered for sale in the County; and generally relating to the sale of Rental Housing. (tabled 4/6/2020 and 5/4/2020) (*Expires 5/11/20; 6/15/20 if extended; or 7/20/20 if extended twice*.)
