- A. Council Resolution No. 150-2011 Proposing to add a section to Article VIII. "Centralized Purchasing" of the Howard County Charter to limit the exercise of the power of eminent domain so that the power is used only for public purposes and not for private economic development, and submitting this amendment to the voters of Howard County for their adoption or rejection in accordance with Article X of the Howard County Charter and Article XIA of the Maryland Constitution.

- the voters of Howard County for their adoption or rejection in accordance with Article X of the Howard County Charter and Article XIA of the Maryland Constitution.
- E. Council Resolution No. 101-2012 Introduced by: The Chair at the Request of the Charter Review Commission Proposing to amend Section 208 "Sessions of the County Council; quorum; rules of procedure", Section 209 "Legislative Procedure", Section 210 "Recording, printing and compilation of laws", and Section 604 "Filing of proposed budget; copies" of the Howard County Charter by changing various publication and advertising requirements to provide that certain information also be made available in at least one electronic medium; proposing to amend Section 209 "Legislative procedure" of the Howard County Charter by permitting the County Council to extend the amount of time to post emergency legislation; and submitting this amendment to the voters of Howard County for their adoption or rejection in accordance with Article X of the Howard County Charter and Article XIA of the Maryland Constitution.
- F. Council Resolution No. 102-2012 Introduced by: The Chair at the Request of the Charter Review Commission Proposing to amend Section 209 "Legislative procedure" of the Howard County Charter by permitting the County Council to extend the amount of time to consider legislation before the Council; and submitting this amendment to the voters of Howard County for their adoption or rejection in accordance with Article X of the Howard County Charter and Article XIA of the Maryland Constitution.
- G. Council Resolution No. 103-2012 Introduced by: The Chair at the Request of the Charter Review Commission- Proposing to amend Section 211 "The referendum" of the Howard County Charter by providing that the number of required signatures for a referendum be 5% of the qualified voters of the County calculated upon the whole number of votes cast in the County for Governor at the last preceding gubernatorial election; and submitting this amendment to the voters of Howard County for their adoption or rejection in accordance with Article X of the Howard County Charter and Article XIA of the Maryland Constitution.
- H. Council Resolution No. 104-2012 Introduced by: The Chair at the Request of the Charter Review Commission Proposing to amend Section 611 "Lapsed appropriations" of the Howard County Charter to permit the County to carry over grant funds from one fiscal year to the next; and submitting this amendment to the voters of Howard County for their adoption or rejection in accordance with Article X of the Howard County Charter and Article XIA of the Maryland Constitution.
- I. Council Resolution No. 105-2012 Introduced by: The Chair at the Request of the Charter Review Commission Proposing to amend Section 613 "Restrictions of capital projects; amendment to capital budget after adoption of budget", of the Howard County Charter to clarify the application of the section to new capital projects; requiring the County Council to establish by law procedures for amending the budget when changes to existing capital projects are approved; and submitting this amendment to the voters of Howard County for their adoption or rejection in accordance with Article X of the Howard County Charter and Article XIA of the Maryland Constitution.
- J. Council Resolution No. 106-2012 Introduced by: The Chair at the Request of the Charter Review Commission Proposing to repeal Section 906 "Copies of books and papers on demand" and Section 907 "Inspection of books, accounts, and papers" of the Howard County Charter and replace them with new Section 906 "Right to Inspect and Copy Public Records"; making the public access provisions of the County Charter consistent with the Maryland Public Information Act; expanding the public

- right to inspect records to include all persons; permitting persons to obtain copies of public records upon payment of a reasonable fee prescribed by the County Council; and submitting this amendment to the voters of Howard County for their adoption or rejection in accordance with Article X of the Howard County Charter and Article XIA of the Maryland Constitution.
- K. Council Bill No. 26-2012 Adopting PlanHoward 2030 as the general plan for Howard County, Maryland, for the purpose of planning for land use and land conservation and multiyear development planning for transportation, public facilities, water, sewerage, parkland, housing, human services, and environmental protection; and generally relating to planning, zoning, and land use in Howard County, Maryland.
