Minutes Capital Budget Work Session April 16, 2014, 8:30 a.m. Banneker Room

Howard County Council Chairperson Calvin Ball called the meeting to order at 8:38 a.m.

Members Present: Calvin Ball, Greg Fox, Mary Kay Sigaty, Jen Terrasa, Courtney Watson

Ray Wacks, Budget Director, and Marsha McLaughlin, Director of the Department of Planning and Zoning noted that there is no additional funding authority for agricultural preservation in FY 2015, that all current requests have been satisfied from prior years' funding, and that funds in this category could be used in the east as well as the west.

Ms. McLaughlin further commented on capital projects in the "General County Projects" portion of the capital budget, as follows: C 0337, C0331, C0285, C0286, C0289, C0287, C0298, K5066, T7107.

A comprehensive list of follow-up questions to be answered follows at the end of these minutes.

Chris Merdon, Director of the Department of Communication and Technology Services, described three \$10 million enterprise accounts related to the broadband project. He noted that the Department will not spend from this authority until they are assured of revenues from non-county sources. The discussion included an explanation of the need to segregate enterprise spending from county spending to avoid imposition of a 17% tax.

Ray Wacks discussed the master lease program, a short-term instrument of financing funded within the limits of recommended bonded indebtedness. Mr. Wacks noted that the Director of Finance recommends the financing vehicle for various projects, based on the most attractive costs, the length of life of the item acquired, and other factors. He noted that projects funded with dedicated revenues are not paid with bonds.

Mr. Merdon described the following additional projects: C0414, explaining the source of non-Howard County funds that supplemented the prior years' authorized County spending; C0301, C0311, C0312, C0315, C0327, and C0341.

Jim Irvin, Director of the Department of Public Works highlighted new and significant projects, including C0333, design for upgrades to the detention center; C0182, enclosing the police firing range; C0290, the courthouse addition and renovation, including a garage. He provided comment on the

following additional projects: C0282, C0290, C0299 (joined by Mark DeLuca; C0309; C0313 (joined by Daryl Parnell, new Bureau Chief, Facilities); C0313; C2316; C0318 and C0319; C0322; C0334.

Don Lieu, Bureau of Utilities and Mark Richmond, Stormwater Management joined for a discussion of the following sewer projects: S6293, S6175, S6203, S6268, S6275, S6280, S6269, S6290.

Steve Gerwin joined Don Lieu for a discussion of the following water projects: W8326, w8248, W8265, W8297, W8289, W8307, W8306, W8307, W8323, W8320, and W8324.

Mark DeLuca and Mark Richmond joined for the discussion of storm drainage projects: D1112, D1124, D1148, D1140, D1150, D1158, D 1159, D1160, D1164.

Jay Stiemetz, Project Engineer, joined for a discussion of bridge projects: B3831, B3850, B3858, B3859, B3863.

Kris Jagarapu, Traffic Engineering, joined for the discussion of the following road resurfacing projects: H2014, H2016. Mr. Irvin noted that the resurfacing need would require approximately \$20 million per year. He also noted that Howard County anticipates approximately \$430,000 for pothole repair from State funds, which will be amended into a supplemental appropriation ordinance for FY 2014.

Road construction projects J4110, J4121, J4157, J4167, J4202, J4212, J4224, J4234, and J4238 were highlighted.

Mr. Irvin also discussed the following sidewalk projects: K5034, K5035, K5040, K5043, K5054, and K5061, and K5064.

The following intersection improvements were highlighted: T7087, T7089, T7094, and T7106.
