AGENDA – LEGISLATIVE WORK SESSION

The County Council will hold a Legislative Work Session at 4:30 p.m. on Monday, September 26, 2011 in the Banneker Room, Howard Building, 3430 Courthouse Drive, Ellicott City.

Council Bill No. 50-2011 – Introduced by, The Chairperson at the request of the County Executive and Cosponsored by Calvin Ball, Mary Kay Sigaty, Jennifer Terrasa and Courtney Watson – Pursuant to State law requirements, repealing and reenacting the Howard County Public Ethics Law; defining certain terms; restating the role of the Howard County Ethics Commission and the role of the County Solicitor; authorizing certain late fees for failure to file certain forms; clarifying certain prohibited conduct and interests; clarifying provisions related to gifts and authorizing the acceptance of certain limited types of gifts; maintaining certain exceptions currently allowed under the Howard County Charter; clarifying the disclosure of certain information by elected officials, candidates for elected offices, county employees and board and commission members; clarifying and expanding certain lobbyist provisions including reporting requirements; providing for certain enforcement; and generally relating to the Howard County Public Ethics Law.

Transfer of Appropriation Ordinance No. 1- Fiscal Year 2012 – Transferring \$600,000 in excise tax funding to capital project T7101, State/County Shared Intersections, from capital project J4148, Dorsey Run Road Extension; making certain text changes to the detail pages for Capital Project T7101 in order to authorize certain studies to be funded by the transfer.

Council Resolution No. 150-2011 – Introduced by, Greg Fox – Proposing to add a section to Article VIII. “Centralized Purchasing” of the Howard County Charter to limit the exercise of the power of eminent domain so that the power is used only for public purposes and not for private economic development, and submitting this amendment to the voters of Howard County for their adoption or rejection in accordance with Article X of the Howard County Charter and Article XIA of the Maryland Constitution.
