Introduction of Legislation

The following legislation is introduced by the Chairperson at the request of the County Executive unless otherwise noted:

Appointments

Council Resolution 118-2014 - Introduced by Chairperson, Confirming the reappointment of John D. Lederer to the Board of Appeals of Howard County, Maryland, to fill a term ending on December 31, 2019.

General

Council Bill 52-2014 – AN ACT pursuant to Section 612 of the Howard County Charter, approving a multi-year Energy Performance Contract between Howard County, Maryland and Energy Systems Group, LLC where Energy Systems Group will develop and implement comprehensive energy efficiency guaranteed savings program at certain County facilities and energy using systems.

- Council Bill 53-2014 AN ACT pursuant to Section 612 of the Howard County Charter, approving a multi-year Solar Power & Services Agreement between Howard County, Maryland and Bith Energy, Inc., for the construction of a canopy mounted solar photovoltaic array, with two electric vehicle charging stations powered by the solar canopy, and for the provision of electrical energy output from the canopy; and authorizing the County Executive to take certain actions in connection with the Agreement.
- Council Resolution 119-2014 A RESOLUTION endorsing the provision of financing by the State Department of Business and Economic Development for an economic development project in Howard County and certifying that the project is consistent with the County's plan for economic development.
- Council Resolution 120-2014 A RESOLUTION requesting the Columbia Downtown Housing Corporation to consider whether legislative changes are necessary and appropriate to ensure that the Downtown Columbia Plan's vision for a full spectrum of affordable housing can be achieved and to recommend any changes believed necessary and appropriate to the County Council and County Executive; requiring input from certain stakeholders; establishing certain deadlines; and providing for certain staff assistance.
- Council Resolution 121-2014 A RESOLUTION adopted pursuant to the Maryland Economic Development Revenue Bond Act providing for the issuance by Howard County, Maryland, of up to \$8,035,000 of its limited obligation bonds and the loan of the proceeds thereof to Glenelg Country School, Inc. to be used to (1) refund (a) the Howard County, Maryland Economic Development Revenue Bond (Glenelg Country School Facility) 2001 Issue and (b) Howard County, Maryland Economic Development Revenue Bond (Glenelg Country School Facility) 2008 Issue; and (2) finance the costs of projects on the school's campus, located in the County which include (a) the expansion and revitalization of the athletic facilities, including the construction of a two- story press box, grandstands and restoration of existing tennis courts and athletic center floors, (b) renovation and restoration of exterior and interior structural defects in existing buildings, including the Historic Manor House, and updating fire and safety concerns, and (c) costs of issuance and other related costs; reserving certain rights; providing for the issuance of bond anticipation notes for such purposes; authorizing the County Executive to specify, prescribe, determine, provide for or approve certain matters, details, documents or procedures; and specifying and describing various matters in connection therewith.
- Council Resolution 122-2014 A RESOLUTION pursuant to Section 5-301 of the Education Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland, approving the Howard County Board of Education's Capital Budget Request for Fiscal Year 2016 and Capital Improvement Program Request for Fiscal Years 2017-2021 for the purpose of submission to the Interagency Committee on School Construction.

- Council Bill 49-2014 AN ACT pursuant to Section 612 of the Howard County Charter, approving a multi-year Agreement between Howard County, Maryland and Pictometry International Corp. for certain pictometry services used by the County.
- Council Bill 50-2014 AN ACT establishing a Help To Others (H2O) Round-Up Program to assist residential customers who are facing financial hardships in the payment of their utility service charges; defining certain terms; authorizing certain payments; authorizing certain actions by the Department of Finance; and generally relating to utility service charges in Howard County.

- Council Resolution 114-2014 A RESOLUTION approving the terms and conditions of a Payment in Lieu of Taxes Agreement by and between the Howard County, Maryland and Ellicott LLLP, a limited liability limited partnership, for the renovation and operation of an existing 81-unit senior rental housing project known as Park View at Ellicott City.
